
Sunday Morning

THE CORINTHIAN CONUNDRUM

Lesson 6: Adopting Godly Perspective (1 Corinthians 3:18–4:5)

- **I.** God's perspective of worldly wisdom: The Lord sees the futile nature of man's wisdom and calls us to embrace His viewpoint with humility—1 Corinthians 3:18–23.
 - **A.** Apart from God's wisdom we live self-deceived lives—1 Corinthians 3:18.
 - The path of God's wisdom involves admitting that we can deceive ourselves.
 - The path of God's wisdom begins with humility by acknowledging that innately we do not see things from God's perspective.
 - **B.** God views human wisdom as foolish and empty—1 Corinthians 3:19–20.
 - He entraps the arrogant wise person in his own self-centered foolishness—1 Corinthians 3:19; see Matthew 22:15–22.
 - He understands that the inner dialogue of the so-called wise man is unsubstantial, absurd, and useless—

 1 Corinthians 3:20.
 - **C.** Rather than glorying in people, the Lord calls us to give our praise to the One who has given us all things— *1 Corinthians 3:21–22.*
 - **D.** One important perspective involves understanding that as Christians we belong to Christ and Christ belongs to God—1 Corinthians 3:23.
- **II.** God's perspective of His servants: Those who serve God answer to Him and He alone sees clearly enough to evaluate our motives and ministries—1 Corinthians 4:1–5.
 - **A.** Paul understood that he had been entrusted with a position of service and responsibility to present God's truth that had been hidden in the past—1 Corinthians 4:1.
 - **B.** The responsibility of a steward is to faithfully carry out the ministry that the Lord entrusted to that person—

 1 Corinthians 4:2.
 - **C.** Only the Lord can rightly evaluate our lives and our service to Him—1 Corinthians 4:3–4.
 - **D.** As His servants each of us will be evaluated at the judgment seat of Christ—1 Corinthians 4:5.
