THE CORINTHIAN CONUNDRUM

Lesson 7: Treating Sectarianism (1 Corinthians 4:6–21)

- I. Identifying pride as the cause of sectarianism: The apostle employed his name and Apollos' in his exposé of sectarianism in order to pinpoint the underlying problem of pride—*1 Corinthians 4:6*.
- II. Undermining the pride causing sectarianism: Pride in our individuality and uniqueness is undermined when we realize that God alone is responsible for them, instead of our involvement in a sect—*1 Corinthians 4:7*.
- III. Dismantling the pride causing sectarianism: Paul dismantled the arrogance and self-satisfaction underlying his readers' sectarianism by contrasting it with the apostolic lifestyle of humility and dependency on God—*1 Corinthians 4:8–13*.
- IV. Explaining the use of irony in treating sectarianism: The severity of Paul's ironic rebuke was fueled by the depth of his paternal love for his original readers whom he had introduced to Jesus Christ (cp. Acts 18:7–8) —*1 Corinthians 4:14–15*.
- V. Appealing to the apostolic example in treating sectarianism: The apostle appealed to his readers to follow his mind-set about sectarianism as it was embodied in Timothy whom he was sending to instruct them—*1 Corinthians 4:16–17*.
- VI. Issuing a bottom line in treating sectarianism: Paul explained to the Corinthians that their response to his written rebuke would determine the approach he would adopt during his intended visit to them—*1 Corinthians 4:18–21*.
