
Sunday Morning

THE CORINTHIAN CONUNDRUM

Lesson 7: Treating Sectarianism (1 Corinthians 4:6–21)

I.	Identifying pride as the cause of sectarianism: The apostle employed his name and Apollos' in his exposé of sectarianism
	in order to pinpoint the underlying problem of pride—1 Corinthians 4:6.

- **II.** Undermining the pride causing sectarianism: Pride in our individuality and uniqueness is undermined when we realize that God alone is responsible for them, instead of our involvement in a sect—1 Corinthians 4:7.
- **III.** Dismantling the pride causing sectarianism: Paul dismantled the arrogance and self-satisfaction underlying his readers' sectarianism by contrasting it with the apostolic lifestyle of humility and dependency on God—1 Corinthians 4:8–13.
- **IV.** Explaining the use of irony in treating sectarianism: The severity of Paul's ironic rebuke was fueled by the depth of his paternal love for his original readers whom he had introduced to Jesus Christ (cp. Acts 18:7–8) —1 Corinthians 4:14–15.
- **V.** Appealing to the apostolic example in treating sectarianism: The apostle appealed to his readers to follow his mind-set about sectarianism as it was embodied in Timothy whom he was sending to instruct them—1 Corinthians 4:16–17.
