
Sunday Morning

THE CORINTHIAN CONUNDRUM

Lesson 9: The Christian and Lawsuits (1 Corinthians 6:1–11)

- **I.** Taking other Christians to court: Corinthian Christians were taking other believers to pagan courts to settle their disputes and thus dishonoring the name of Christ—1 Corinthians 6:1–8.
 - **A.** Paul expressed his shock at these believers who were taking one another to pagan courts to settle their disputes—

 1 Corinthians 6:1.
 - **B.** Believers will rule and reign with Christ and judge the world and angels—1 Corinthians 6:2–3.
 - Christians, who will judge the world, should be able to settle disputes between other Christians—

 1 Corinthians 6:2.
 - Christians, who will judge angels, should be able to judge between fellow believers who have issues with each other—1 Corinthians 6:3.
 - **C.** Astonishingly the Corinthians had not sought out one wise person who could discern the facts of a case between believers and render a fair decision—*1 Corinthians 6:4–5*.
 - **D.** It appalled the apostle that the Corinthians would look outside the church to settle disputes and let unbelievers settle the matters—1 Corinthians 6:6: see 1 Corinthians 10:32–33.
 - **E.** He urged them to endure the wrong rather than seek revenge—1 Corinthians 6:7.
 - **F.** The motives of those going to court was to win at all costs and this demonstrated the divided nature of the Corinthian church—1 Corinthians 6:8.
- **II.** Persistent unrighteous behavior causes the loss of the rich reward of one's inheritance—1 Corinthians 6:9–11.
 - **A.** Unrighteous behavior does not forfeit eternal life but it does forfeit one's honor and reward in the kingdom—


 1 Corinthians 6:9a; see 1 Corinthians 3:14–15; 2 Corinthians 5:9–10.
 - **B.** Christians can commit the unrighteous behavior mentioned here as evidenced by the Corinthians behavior—

 1 Corinthians 6:9b-10.
 - C. While some of the Corinthians had been ensnared in unrighteous behavior, they had a new identity in Christ which could enable them to live righteously—1 Corinthians 6:11.
