Since the celebration will last approximately three hours, with a significant portion devoted to teaching, attendance is limited to those of junior high age and up. Men will be required to wear a *yarmulke*, which we will provide.

THE CORINTHIAN CONUNDRUM

Lesson 12: Remaining in the Condition You Were Called (1 Corinthians 7:10–24)

- I. The issue of divorce: God designed marriage to be a life-long relationship between a man and a woman—*1 Corinthians 7:10–11*.
 - A. The Lord instructed married people to stay married and not divorce—*1 Corinthians 7:10; see Mark 10:2–12*.
 - B. If a divorce should occur, except for certain reasons, the couple should remain unmarried or reconcile—*1 Corinthians 7:11*.
- II. The issue of spiritually mixed marriages: Believers who are married to unbelievers should remain married unless the unbeliever wants to divorce—*1 Corinthians 7:12–16*.
 - A. Paul addresses an issue here that the Lord never addressed in His earthly ministry but is now addressing through Paul—*1 Corinthians 7:12a*.
 - B. A believer who is married to an unbeliever, and that unbelieving spouse wants to stay in the marriage, should remain married to his/her unbelieving mate—*1 Corinthians 7:12b–13*.
 - C. The Lord can use the believing spouse to work in the life of the unbelieving one as well as in their children's lives—*1 Corinthians 7:14*.
 - D. If an unbelieving spouse decides to divorce the believer, the believing spouse should let the unbeliever go and realize they have the freedom to remarry—*1 Corinthians 7:15–16*.
- III. The issue of the status quo: The Lord directs believers to bloom where they have been planted—*1 Corinthians 7:17–24*.
 - A. Three times the apostle states the principle that God calls believers to walk with Him in the place where He established them—*1 Corinthians 7:17, 20, 24*.
 - B. The external trappings of religion or lack thereof do not matter—*1 Corinthians 7:18*.
 - C. What matters is cultivating one's relationship with the Lord—*1 Corinthians 7:19*.
 - D. Regardless of one's life situation, the Lord calls each one to serve Him in the place in which he finds himself—*1 Corinthians 7:21–24*.
