

### Passover Seder Dinner

Jesus and His disciples celebrated the Passover throughout their lives. Following that same pattern, we will observe the traditional meal with lamb—but from a decidedly Christian point of view.

Since the celebration will last approximately three hours, with a significant portion devoted to teaching, attendance is limited to those of junior high age and up. Men will be required to wear a *yarmulke*, which we will provide.

Registration continues in the Main Hall this morning—please be sure to sign up if you plan to attend. Childcare is provided for infants only, with reservation required at sign-up.

THE CORINTHIAN CONUNDRUM

Lesson 13: Living in Uncertain Times (1 Corinthians 7:25–40)

- I. **Staying the course:** A person can choose to either be married or remain single—*1 Corinthians 7:25–28*.
  - A. In light of looming persecution, Paul advised believers to remain in the condition in which they found themselves—*1 Corinthians 7:25–26*.
  - B. In uncertain times, marriage remains a legitimate option but inevitably comes with challenges—*1 Corinthians 7:27–28*.

- II. **Living with eternal perspective:** Regardless of one’s circumstances, the Lord calls each of us to live for eternal purposes—*1 Corinthians 7:29–35*.
  - A. Paul encourages believers to live in light of the imminent return of Christ—*1 Corinthians 7:29a*; see *Romans 13:11*.
  - B. Paul encourages believers to not be overwhelmed or controlled by the circumstances of this temporary world—*1 Corinthians 7:29b–31*.
  - C. The single person has greater freedom to serve the Lord with less distraction, while the married person must also be concerned with family matters—*1 Corinthians 7:32–35*.

- III. **Parenting wisely:** In a world of arranged marriages, a father had to make a wise decision about his daughter’s future life—*1 Corinthians 7:36–38*.
  - A. This addresses the issue of a man with an older, unmarried daughter—*1 Corinthians 7:36a*.
  - B. In light of uncertain times, if he wants to give her in marriage, he does not sin—*1 Corinthians 7:36b*.
  - C. A father in such a situation must make the decision he believes is best—*1 Corinthians 7:37–38*.

- IV. **The widow and remarriage:** A widow has the freedom to marry again as long as she does so wisely and marries a believer—*1 Corinthians 7:39–40*.

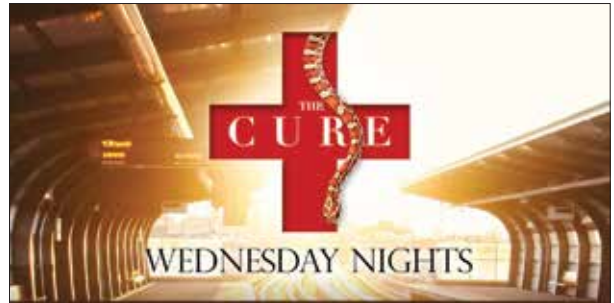

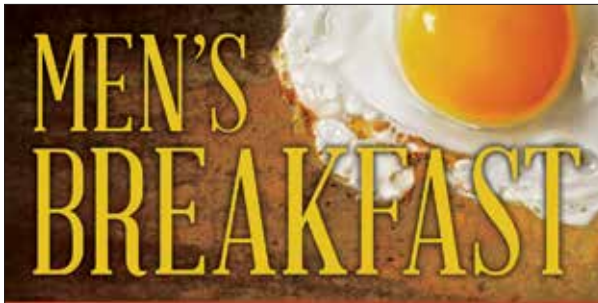
