

Though there is a dental office on campus, the residents of ACA have no insurance and virtually no preventative dental care available to them. Therefore, I went to India offering my skills in the same capacity as I have here with MOM.

Dr. Jani Velpuri is the resident dentist at ACA, and he welcomed me into his practice, providing time, equipment, supplies, and moral support. He arranged the scheduling of appointments and was present to assist me with each patient. Though the equipment was not what you'd find in a Western facility, I was fortunate to have what I needed through his generosity—and that of our church family who gave to support this mission.

I was able to provide dental care for the staff and faculty of ACA. Some were American missionaries teaching at the Academy. They were pleased with the opportunity to have a cleaning while on campus instead of having to wait until they were back in the United States.

As for the Indian staff members, the opportunity was a new adventure! Many had gone to dentists in their local towns and asked to have their teeth cleaned, but were told they didn't need it. Therefore, most never had anything except emergency dental care. It was a blessing to work with these dauntless,

appreciative people who were eager to learn how to improve their health.

Asian Christian Academy is truly an oasis of Christian faith in a country of idol worship. It provides an orphanage, school, and seminary dedicated to educating students who then go into their communities and introduce Jesus Christ to the lives of others.

I am honored to have taken part in this ministry.
I want to thank all those who help make ACA's efforts a success.

THE CORINTHIAN CONUNDRUM

Lesson 17: The Possibility of Being Disqualified (1 Corinthians 10:1–13)

- **I. The divine favors in Israel's history:** In spite of experiencing the Lord's abundant favor, the Israelites of the Exodus era eventually suffered divine discipline to the point of losing their lives in the wilderness—*1 Corinthians 10:1–5*.
 - **A.** He personally walked them through the wilderness experience (Exodus 13:21)—1 Corinthians 10:1a.
 - **B.** He protected them from their enemies, both natural and human (Exodus 14:22)—1 Corinthians 10:1b.
 - **C.** He provided human leadership for them through Moses in order to overcome the potholes and pitfalls of their wilderness experience (Acts 7:35–36)—1 Corinthians 10:2.
 - **D.** He physically sustained them with a daily provision of manna (Exodus 16:4)—1 Corinthians 10:3.
 - **E.** He satisfied their physical thirst by providing water for them at key points in their journey (Exodus 17:5–6) through the preincarnate Christ (Exodus 14:19)—*1 Corinthians 10:4*.
 - **F.** The Lord disqualified the men of the Exodus generation from entering the Promised Land, as evidenced by their deaths in the wilderness over a 40-year period—1 Corinthians 10:5.
- **II. The human failures in Israel's history:** The reason for the mass disqualification of the Exodus generation of Israelite men was their sinful attitudes, words, and behaviors—1 Corinthians 10:6–11.
 - **A.** They craved Egyptian food instead of what the Lord had chosen to satisfy their needs (Numbers 11:4–5)— 1 Corinthians 10:6.
 - **B.** They transferred their gratitude from the Lord to lifeless idols (Exodus 32:1–6)—1 Corinthians 10:7.
 - **C.** They fell prey to sexual immorality and were disciplined with death from the hand of God (Numbers 25:1–2,6–9)—
 - **D.** They questioned God's purpose and plan for them in the wilderness and consequently experienced His wrath (Numbers 21:4–6)—1 Corinthians 10:9.
 - **E.** They belly-ached against the leaders whom the Lord had appointed for them and were struck with a near-complete plaque because of it (Numbers 16:41–49)—1 Corinthians 10:10.
 - **F.** The historical account of Israel's mass disqualification urges us to be faithful to the end—1 Corinthians 10:11.
- **III.** The personal admonition from Israel's history: We are in real danger of replicating Israel's failure and disqualification, which should drive us to trust in the Lord's promise to arm us against any and all temptations—1 Corinthians 10:12–13.
 - **A.** All of us are in imminent danger of spiritual failure and the resulting consequence of being disqualified from divine commendation and reward—1 Corinthians 10:12.
 - **B.** The Lord assures us that He is always "ready, willing, and able" to provide us with whatever we need to resist any and all temptations to turn from Him and become disqualified—1 Corinthians 10:13.
