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

This Morning

Lesson 33: The Value of Relationships—1 Corinthians 16:5–24 Reggie Coe, Family Pastor

- **I. Paul's desire to come:** He wanted to come and stay with the Corinthians for a season—

 1 Corinthians 16:5–7.
 - **A.** Paul valued long-term relationships—1 Corinthians 16:5.
 - **B.** Long-term relationships take time—1 Corinthians 16:6–7.
- **II. Paul's resolve to stay:** He chose to remain in Ephesus and continue to minister there because of the opportunity and because of the opposition—*1 Corinthians 16:8–9.*
 - **A.** In Ephesus there was a great opportunity for ministry—1 Corinthians 16:8–9a.
 - **B.** There was also great opposition in Ephesus—1 Corinthians 16:9b.
- **III.** Paul's representatives whom he sent: He had Timothy and some others come to minister to the Corinthians in his place—1 Corinthians 16:10–11.
 - **A.** He wanted them well received—1 Corinthians 16:10.
 - **B.** He wanted them sent along their way well—1 Corinthians 16:11.
- **IV. Paul's bond with Apollos:** While there was division between the factions of Paul and Apollos in Corinth, no such division existed between them personally—1 *Corinthians 16:12*.
- V. Paul's exhortation to the Corinthians: He strongly encouraged the church in Corinth to stand firm in the faith and to minister out of love for the Lord and others— 1 Corinthians 16:13–14. see 1 Corinthians 13:1–8.13.
- **VI. Paul's affirmation of Stephanas' ministry:** He insisted on the Corinthians subjecting themselves to the leaders of this church—1 *Corinthians* 16:15–16.
- **VII. Paul's appreciation of the Corinthians' ministry:** He expressed his thanks for the Corinthian church sending their support and care through Stephanas—1 *Corinthians* 16:17–18.
- **VIII. Paul's greeting of grace:** He sent greetings from those with him from himself and encouraged the Corinthians to be genuinely affectionate with one another—
 1 Corinthians 16:19–24.
