## THE PREEMINENCE OF CHRIST

## Lesson 1: Marks of a Healthy Church *Colossians 1:1-8*

- I. Grace and peace: As an apostle, Paul longed for the church at Colossae to know the unmerited favor of God and the stability that a relationship with Christ brings (Colossians 1:1–2)
  - A. His role: Paul knew his part in God's plan and embraced it (Colossians 1:1)
  - **B.** His appreciation: He valued the Colossians' walk with Christ (Colossians 1:2a)
  - C. His desire: He wanted them to continue to experience and to walk in God's unmerited favor (Colossians 1:2b)
  - **D.** His longing: He yearned for them to experience stability in every type of circumstance (*Colossians 1:2c*)
- II. Thanks and praise: Paul thanked the Lord for their authenticity (Colossians 1:3–8)
  - **A.** Their faith: This church body actively depended on Christ, having received and walked with Him by faith (*Colossians 1:3–4a*)
  - B. Their love: This church expressed genuine care and devotion for one another (Colossians 1:4b)
  - C. Their hope: The Colossians lived with an eternal focus, looking forward to their certain foundation for the future (*Colossians 1:5*)
  - **D.** Their impact: The people in this church body expressed the life of Christ in the world in which they lived by making a difference for Christ (Colossians 1:6)
  - E. Their report: Paul was encouraged when Epaphras delivered the good news of the Colossians' Christ-like character to him (*Colossians 1:7–8*)
