THE PREEMINENCE OF CHRIST

Lesson 4: The Mystery of the Church Colossians 1:24–29

Revelation of the mystery of Christ: Paul suffered for preaching of the mystery of the gospel of Christ, which means that God has placed Jews and Gentiles into one body (*Colossians 1:24–29*).

- I. Suffering: Being a servant of Christ brought about suffering in Paul's life (*Colossians 1:24*).
 - A. Christ's death and suffering for our sins on the cross was complete and sufficient for our salvation (1 Peter 3:18).
 - **B.** Paul's sufferings emerged due to his calling by Christ to take the gospel to the Gentiles (Acts 9:3–5, 15–16).
 - C. As followers of Christ, we should expect suffering in light of His suffering (1 Peter 4:1–2).
 - D. Paul took great joy in being able to suffer for Christ in his service to the church (*Colossians 1:24*).
- II. Stewardship: Paul focused on fulfilling the responsibility God had given Him to proclaim the good news of the gospel, especially to Gentiles (*Colossians 1:25*).
 - **A.** The Lord entrusted Paul with the responsibility of taking the gospel to the Gentiles (*Colossians 1:25a*).
 - **B.** Paul's ministry of the gospel fulfilled God's calling on his life and God's directive to take the gospel into all the world (*Colossians 1:25b; Matthew 28:19–20*).
- III. Mystery: The previously hidden truth that now has been revealed is that God has put Jews and Gentiles together into one body (*Colossians 1:26–27; Ephesians 3:1–7*).
- IV. Maturity: Paul aimed at developing Christians to be mature followers of Christ so that He might do all He desires in each believer's life (*Colossians 1:28*).
- V. Ministry: Paul worked tirelessly, all the time trusting Christ to work through him to accomplish what God called him to do (*Colossians 1:29*).
