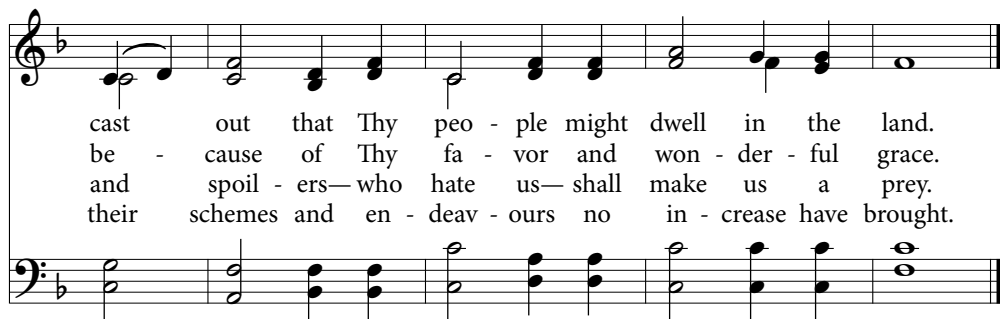
1. O Lord, we have heard, for the Scrip - tures have told,
