

“Master Over the Tempest”

Mark 4:35-41

1. The disciples thought it was the end! Their own logic and their own sailing prowess had failed them and the storm was threatening to rip their boat apart.
2. If they lived through it, it would have been a story that would have stuck in their minds forever. However, it was an account that stuck in their minds for a different reason. It wasn't the storm that made the deepest impression, but the care and power seen in the Master over the tempest.
3. Lots of people today are beginning to anticipate how bad the storm will be in our day. They want to make prophetic predictions, dire warnings, and catastrophic outlooks.
4. Yet, in the midst of the tempest, the Master still wants us—who are in the boat with Him, to recognize who He is and to see His care for us.
5. Notice some things that Mark 4, Luke 8 and Matthew 8 have to teach us about the care of the Master.
