

PRONOUNS

In English grammar pronouns **replace nouns**. Also, pronouns come in four different forms: subject, object, possessive adjective and possessive pronouns.

Subject Pronoun	Object Pronoun	Possessive Adjective	Possessive Pronoun
I	me	my	mine
we	us	our	ours
you	you	your	yours
they	them	their	theirs
he	him	his	his
she	her	her	hers
it	it	its	-----

SUBJECT PRONOUNS

Subject pronouns come **before verbs**.

EXAMPLES

- **I** am Ali.
- **You** look tired.
- Ahmad is angry, and **he** wants Saleh to apologize.
- My car is new. **It** cost SR100,000.
- **We** aren't students..
- **They** like traveling.

OBJECT PRONOUNS

Object pronouns come **after verbs**.

EXAMPLES

- Give **me the book**.
- The teacher wants to talk to **you**.
- Jack is hurt because Bill hit **him**.
- John received a letter from **her** last week.
- Mark can't find **it**.
- Don't be angry with **us**.
- Tell **them** to hurry up!

POSSESSIVE ADJECTIVES

Possessive adjectives **must be followed by a noun.**

EXAMPLES

- I can't find **my shoes**.
- Mr. Michael wants to see **your homework**.
- Khalid drives his car.
- Sara does her homework in afternoon.
- The cat broke **its leg**.
- This is **our house**.
- Where are **their books**?

POSSESSIVE PRONOUNS

Possessive pronouns **must not be followed by a noun.** They come before verbs and **usually** come at the end of a sentence.

EXAMPLES

- This pen is **mine**.
- **This book is new. Yours** is old.
- That car looks like **his**.
- This bag is not **hers**.
- That school is **ours**.
- **Our house is near, but theirs** is very far.

MORE PRONOUNS

Pronouns: (**This**, **That**, **These** and **Those**) are used to show the distance between the speaker and the noun.

[**This** and **That**] are used for **singular**.

[**These** and **Those**] are used for **plural**.

[**This** and **These**] are used for **something near**.

[**That** and **Those**] are used for **something far**.

EXAMPLES:

- This is my book over here.
- This book over here is mine.
- That is your house over there.
- That house over there is yours.
- These are our cars.
- These cars are ours.
- Those are her shoes.
- Those shoes are hers.
