Last week our students in Grades 3 and 5 received their Naplan results. Collectively this year, across both grade levels, we have shown great improvement in all curriculum areas. This is the reflection of the hard work and dedicated teaching staff across the school and consistent approach over time. The results of these tests provide information for our teachers and the school about student achievement and learning programs. Naplan tests provide point-in-time information regarding student progress in Literacy and Numeracy and are used to complement the wide range of formal and informal testing that are already in use.

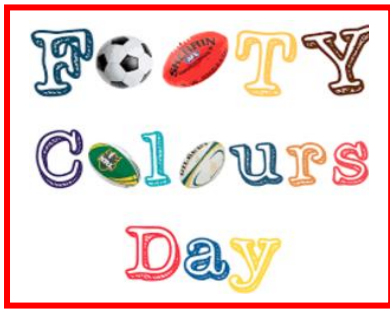
GRADE 5DM NEWS
