Principal’s Report

Naplan

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is an annual assessment for students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9. It tests the sorts of skills that are essential for every child to progress through school and life, such as reading, writing, spelling and numeracy. The assessments are undertaken nationwide, every year, in the second full week in May. NAPLAN is made up of tests in the four areas (or ‘domains’) of: reading, writing, language conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy. Our students approach this testing period with maturity, confidence and a willing to do the best they possibly can. Within each year of a student’s education we use a variety of formative assessments and evidence to gather information about where a student is with their learning, Naplan is only one measure of a child’s academic success; it is not certainly not **the** measure.

School Review

Last week, the leadership team had dedicated time together to analyse a wide variety of different sources of school wide data against the goals and targets of our strategic plan. This process was a valuable learning experience for all and provides a collaborative experience to review our progress and begin to set the next stage of learning. This evening will be focussed around getting a deeper picture of the academic, wellbeing, engagement of students and opinions of the general school culture from our school community. The junior school is working on understanding how to use a video camera. Students are able to view their performances as a class to plan ways to improve them in the future.


