Important Traffic Update

From the first day of Term 3 there will be some major changes to the Lucknow Primary School Bus loop, Kiss 'n Drop and Disabled parking spaces.

The current bus loop will no longer be in use and all buses will pick up and drop off on Howitt Avenue. Part of the Kiss 'n Drop zone on Howitt Avenue will become the new Bus Zone, with the three spaces on the northern side of the crossing remaining. A new Kiss 'n Drop zone will be allocated in the former bus loop. The current disabled parking spaces that are located within the staff car park will be moved to Balmoral Crescent, outside the front gate.

These changes have been made in consultation with Public Transport Victoria and the East Gippsland Shire to conform with current legislation and more importantly for the safety of student attending Lucknow Primary School and those from other schools using the bus loop.

We hope to make further improvements to the parking arrangements and traffic management for parents in the future with the co-operation of the East Gippsland Shire. Please see map below:



Main Points:

- The bus loop will no longer be in use. Buses will drop off and pick up on Howitt Avenue.
- Part of the Kiss'n Drop zone will be moved from Howitt Avenue to the Bus Loop.
- Disabled Parking will be on Balmoral Crescent.

Japan

LANGUAGE & CULTURE



"Kon'nichiwa". During Term 2, classes participating in Language and Culture lessons have had an introduction to Japan and its culture, as well as being exposed to some basic Japanese words.

- We found out some interesting facts about Japan: such as the fact that they grow square watermelons for easier stacking and that dancing is prohibited in public places without a permit!
- We have continued to understand the importance of passports, customs and security at airports.
- We located Japan on a world map and looked at some basic geographical features of the country; such as the fact that it is situated in the "Ring of Fire".
- Depending on their grade level, the students "visited" some amazing landmarks; such as the famous *Great Buddha of Kamakura, Itsukushima Shrine, Bullet Trains, Jigokudani Monkey Park, Mount Fuji and Tokyo Tower.*
- We learnt about celebrations such as Children's Day and the wonderful Koinobori kites which are part of this important day. We also marveled at the Onbashira-Sai Festival where teams ride a log down a muddy hillside for glory- (often with dire consequences!)
- We discovered that there are different methods of storytelling and that the Japanese use these to teach their children good manners and behaviour.
- We looked at models of typical Japanese houses and apartments, then compared these with our homes.
- We attempted the Japanese art of origami with mixed results!
- When we studied traditional Japanese clothing, the students designed some wonderful paper "kimonos". Some of the children enjoyed dressing up in our kimonos and geta sandals.
- We looked at some interesting aspects of Japanese etiquette and learnt that it is good manners to slurp your noodles and to drink soup out of the bowl, but bad manners to blow your nose in public!
- The Japanese arts of Anime and Manga proved a popular topic with many students. I was able to witness some amazing artistic talents as the students turned their hand to sketching Anime characters.
- When the topic of Food was covered, the children sampled some unusual Japanese snacks. Some of the faces the students pulled were priceless!!
- Some grades were introduced to what schooling is like in Japan and were able to make comparisons to our school.
- The senior grades had a look at religion in Japan and learnt a few facts about the Shinto way of life.

As you can see, it has been another busy term! Next semester a new group of students will be taking part in Language and Culture lessons. These children will study a unit on Japan first and then France in term 4.
