- Have students develop an iMovie trailer for the novel. The imovie must contain detailed information about the characters and the plot but must avoid sharing the ending of the novel.
- 2. Create a diorama that represents an important setting from the book. You must include a one paragraph summary explaining why you picked this setting as the most important setting and its impact it had on the novel.

- 3. Create an infographic on canva.com. The infographic must include detailed information from the text regarding details about the characters and then the greatest conflict that the main characters faced.
- 4. Create a newspaper with 2-3 articles minimally retelling 3 major moments in the novel through the lense of a news reporter. You must include visuals just as a newspaper would.
- 5. Create a movie poster with a detailed image that would make viewers want to watch the "movie". You must include a tagline that would grab a viewer's attention and write a 10 sentence summary of the novel.
- 6. Write a character analysis paper. Identify 4 main personality traits for your character and use detailed evidence from the text to support those personality traits. You should have 4 paragraphs, each should have evidence and a description of the personality trait.
- 7. Use Scratch (scratch.mit.edu) to retell the plot of the story A Long Walk to Water. Use your plot mountain terms: Exposition, Rising Action, Climax, Falling Action, and Resolution.
- 8. Create a comic strip that retells the Climax of the story and/or an important part of the story. Make sure to be detailed in your images. You may do this by hand and/or use an online platform such as storyboardthat.com.
- 9. Create a different ending for the novel.
- 10. Choose any idea that is represented in the book (borehole well, conflict in Sudan, lifestyle etc.) and research that topic. Write a brief research paper explaining that concept. Make sure to create a works cited page to cite your resources.
- 11. Write a thank you letter to Salva Dut explaining your appreciation for the work that he does.
- 12. Create a timeline of events for the novel. This can be done by hand and/or using an online platform (prezi). You MUST include images to support your timeline and a 3-4 sentence paragraph for each event telling why it is important for the storyline.
