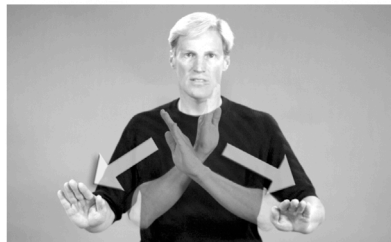
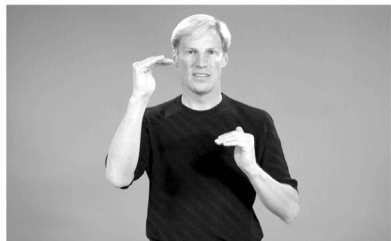


# Sign Language for “An Advent Song”

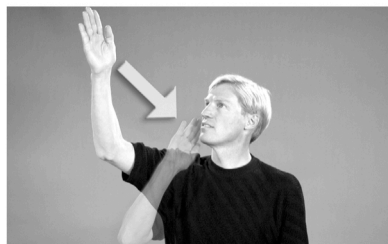

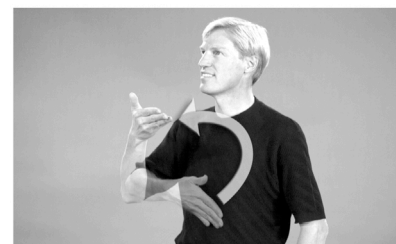
**Peace** – Bring both open hands, palms facing angled outward, in a smooth movement in front of the mouth downward and outward to about shoulder width at lower chest level, like “safe” in baseball.



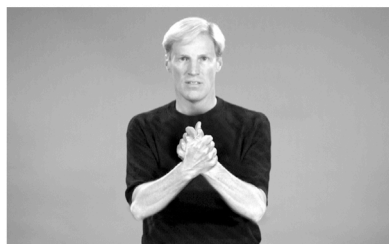
**Hope/hopes** – With the right open hand near the right side of the forehead and the left open hand forward of the left side of the forehead, palms facing each other, bend the fingers down on both hands toward each other twice. The idea is that you are taking a thought and looking for it in the future.



**God** – Move the right hand, palm left, from above the head downward in an arc toward the face. The hand comes down from heaven.



**Joy** – Bring the right flat palm, fingers pointing left, upward and outward on the chest.



**Love** – Cross the arms of both “a” hands at wrists, palms toward body, across the chest as though you are holding something dear to yourself.
