Luke 2:11

Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is Christ the Lord.



A young woman named Mary was chosen to carry the Christ-child. An angel appeared to her and revealed the news. This messenger instructed the teenager to name her son, Jesus. Mary, however, was pledged to be married to Joseph from Nazareth. Seeing as how a virgin should not be with child, Joseph was going to quietly break up with her. An angel then appeared to Joseph and relayed the news to him about the child. Joseph immediately understood and obeyed the Lord's command.



A royal decree went out that all the known world was to be taxed. Everyone had to go to their place of birth and register and pay the taxes. Joseph was born in Bethlehem,



the city of David, so he and Mary made their way to this small town. Mary was about ready to have the baby. When they got to Bethlehem all the rooms were filled up—no sleeping places were available! An animal stable was offered to them and they took it. That is where the God-man was born, amidst the animals he created. He was wrapped in swaddling clothes and laid in a manger.
