BIBLE STORY

I wonder if deception is a theme in the life of Jacob? It seems to crop up a lot in the stories about him in the Bible. He deceived his brother Esau, his father Isaac, and now in the following story he continues this cunning practice.

Perhaps in return for the deception that Laban did by switching daughters on him, Jacob mounts an elaborate ruse. He begins to breed the livestock so that he will get the



good ones and that Laban will get the bad, lame ones. It works well. Laban's sons notice Jacob's increasing wealth and wonder if they should fear this man. Jacob notices that "Laban's attitude toward him was not what it had been" (Genesis 31:2). And to top off the warning bells, the Lord speaks: "Go back to the land of your fathers and to your relatives, and I will be with you" (Genesis 31:3).

Jacob obeys. He gathers up his wives, servants, children, and his livestock and secretly tries to leave. Laban catches wind of this and pursues Jacob, almost as an act of war. They meet and discuss the situation. They end up establishing a covenant, a promise between the two of them not to harm each other.

And so Jacob continues on his way. He prepares to reunite with his brother Esau, who by the way, wanted to kill him twenty years earlier. Had Esau's opinion of Jacob changed in twenty years? Jacob would soon find out. He sent his family and all of his stuff ahead to meet Esau and he was left alone...at night...and something happens:

"...a man wrestled with [Jacob] until daybreak. When the man saw that he could not overpower him, he touched the socket of Jacob's hip so that his hip was wrenched as he wrestled with the man. Then the man said, 'Let me go, for it is daybreak.'

"But Jacob replied, 'I will not let you go unless you bless me.'

"The man asked him, 'What is your name?'

"'Jacob,' he answered.

"Then the man said, "Your name will no longer be Jacob, but Israel, because you have struggled with God and with men and have overcome" (Genesis 32:24-28).



Later, Jacob was warmly received by Esau, and eventually Jacob settles at a place called Bethel. Remember? The "house of God" and the "gate of heaven."

Thus, Jacob and his family returned to the land that God had promised and they settled there.
