


Spectators

- Religious observances: dedicated space provided for Muslim prayer time and Shabbat






Digital Poster Parade

- Team digital posters will be featured on screen during break







Google Jamboard files

- Click on the three dots for "More Actions", "Save frame as image" to save as JPEG or PNG

How does it work?

- A moderator asks questions about the books, including at least one question about each book.
- Questions read aloud twice to the entire group.
- Each team has 30 seconds to discuss their thoughts and determine an answer.
- Teams answer using a paper answer sheet and pencil
- All questions answered by selecting the correct title and author pairing from the resource sheet.
- At the end of the round, paper score sheets passed down the row to collectors standing in aisles
- Correct answers read aloud after answers are collected.



How does it work: Answering

- Resource sheet (provided in team packet at check-in)
 - 8 x 11" laminated sheet
 - Lists titles and authors next to alphabetical answer key (A-J)
- Answer sheet (provided in team packet at check-in)
 - Approx. 4 x 5" paper that fits on provided clipboard
 - Team name at the top
 - Ten numbered spaces for answers
 - One sheet per round sheets show question numbers in ascending order
 - Teams circle the alphabetical answer in each appropriate space for each question read with provided pencil

How does it work: Answering

- Rounds
 - Ten questions per round
 - Teams mark the appropriate answer on their answer sheet as each question read
 - At the end of each round, coaches for each team pass their answer sheet down the row to collectors
 - Collectors put answer sheets in envelope, color coded per round
 - Envelopes taken to the back of the stage for scoring



How does it work: Answering

Rounds

- After answer sheets collected, moderator will read the questions again and provide answers
- Once all questions and answers from previous round read, new round begins
- Teams will take out appropriate round answer sheet from their packet and place on provided clipboard
- Questions read for new round and teams write in alphabetical answer from resource sheet
- At the end of the round, coaches pass down round's answer sheet to collectors in rows
- Process followed for each round



How does it work: Scoring

- Each answer worth two points
- The last question of each round is bonus worth four points (two bonuses total)
- After collector collects answer sheets, they are taken to back of stage to tabulators
- Tabulators score the answer sheets
- At the end of the night, tabulators total up the scores per team
- Teams answering 95% or more correctly will get a gold medal (one medal per person) and trophy for the school. If multiple teams from the same school win Gold, only one trophy will be awarded.
- Teams scoring 90-94% will get a silver medal (one medal per person).



Sample types of questions

- Direct quote from a character in the book.
- Question or statement about something that happens in the book.
- ▶ Passage taken directly from a book.
- Question about something from an illustration or picture.

ALL PARTS of the books distributed to teams MAY be considered for questions.



Awards: Top Scores

- GOLD: Teams answering 95% or more correctly will get a gold medal (one medal per person) and trophy for the school.
- ➤ SILVER: Teams scoring 90-94% will get a silver medal (one medal per person).
- Trophies for each winning team's school delivered in May. One trophy per school (e.g., 3 winners at same school = 1 trophy)



Awards: Categories

- Categories:
 - Best Team Costume
 - Best Team Name
 - Best Team Poster
 - Best Team Sportsmanship
- Awarded to top three teams per seating section.
- Each team member receives certificate delivered to schools for distribution.

Costumes

- Judges will look for costumes designed and produced by students. They will reward creativity and use of recycled items.
- Costumes must comply with all requirements listed in HCPSS Policy 9210: Student Dress Code, including but not limited to:
 - No gory costumes
 - No masks that cover eyes
 - No toys that resemble weapons
 - No roller blades, skateboards, or other footwear with wheels.
- If you are not allowed to wear it to school, you are not allowed to wear it to Battle of the Books.
- All props must fit securely under auditorium seats.



Parent Responsibilities

Check FAQs at hclibrary.org/battleofthebooks

Respond to communications from coaches in a timely manner.

Prepare your child for the length and noise level of the event.

Reinforce all the goals of the event it's so much more than their team's score.

Ensure your child arrives to check in at Merriweather on time (starting at 5 pm and no later than 6:45 pm).
