Such an agreement provides a school's students with course materials for an entire year for one annual fee.

Harvard Business Publishing offers two types of seamless access for instructors and students accessing our content: "Single Sign-On" and "Local-Hosting."

Single Sign-On

Single Sign-On refers to a technical integration between Blackboard and Harvard Business Publishing's eLearning platform. Benefits include:

- Seamless access—students are not required to register or log in to the Harvard Business for Educators web site. That means one less username and password for students and faculty to manage.
- A school can use its LMS roster to facilitate assigning students to teams and roles in certain simulations.
- HBP can assist in reporting use of eLearning materials for anything students access via the integration.

Blackboard 9.x customers: This integration was developed as an official Building Block integration with Blackboard. Documentation is available for both faculty and LMS administrators

Local Hosting

Local hosting refers to the ability for a school to deploy certain Harvard Business Publishing course materials on its Blackboard instance (as opposed to putting a link in Blackboard that delivers students to content hosted elsewhere). Benefits include:

- Seamless access—removes the need for students to register/login to the Harvard Business for Educators website.
- Integration of performance data—online course pre- and post-exams are delivered natively through the Blackboard quiz tool and the results are integrated directly into the Blackboard grade book.
- Integrated tracking data—depending on the configuration, tracking student progress through content is handled natively within Blackboard.
