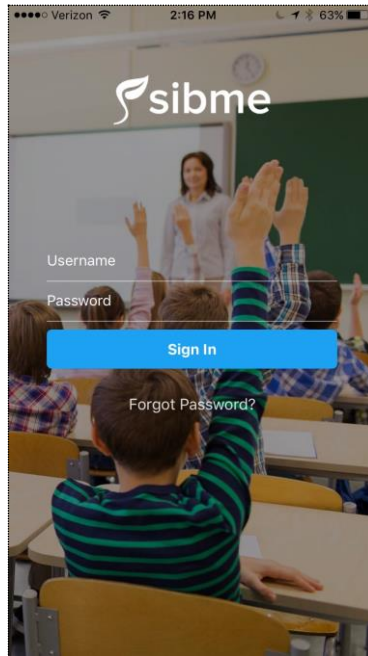
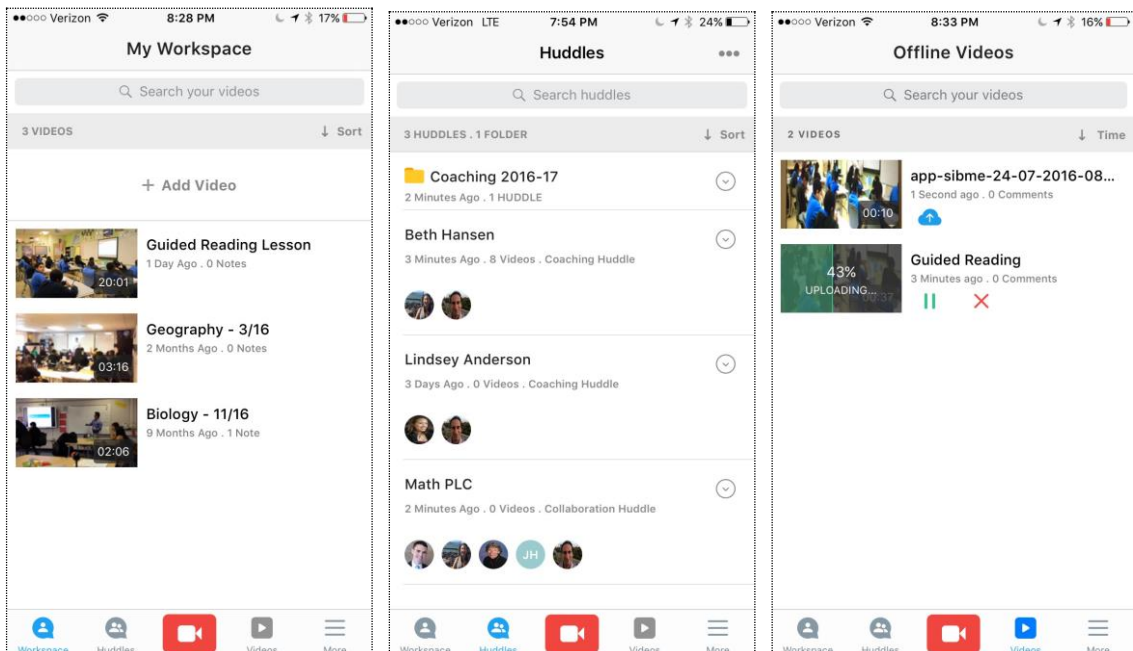


SIBME IOS APP (IPHONE, IPAD, IPOD TOUCH)

1. Download the app from itunes: <https://itunes.apple.com/us/app/sibme/id629939151?mt=8>
2. Login with same email address/username and password that you use to login to Sibme on the web at app.sibme.com



3. Once you login you will see your private Workspace. At the bottom of the screen, you will see a navigation menu where you can access Workspace, Huddles, Record Video, Offline Videos, and More (Settings)



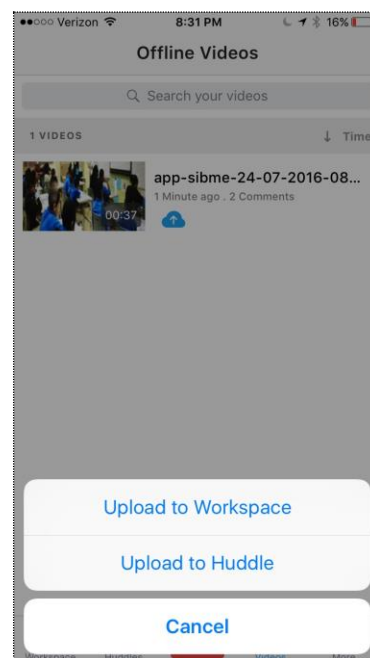
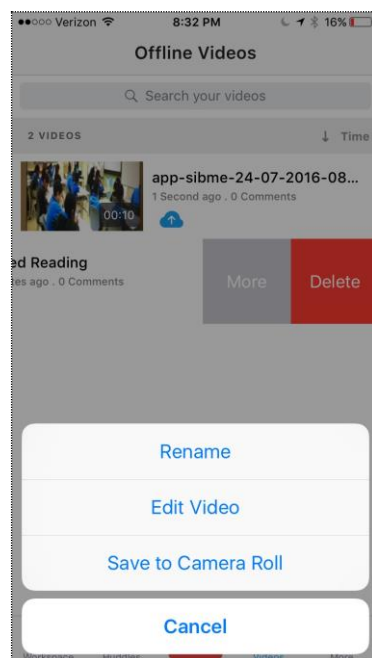
- To record a new video, press the record button on the bottom navigation menu. Click record video.

It is advisable to log-in to the Sibme App **and** put your phone on airplane mode during the recording process to avoid receiving calls that could disrupt your video recording.



- Once you stop recording, the video will save to Offline Videos and automatically upload to your private Sibme cloud workspace (enabled by default). If you cancel upload or disable auto upload you have the option to watch the video, rename it, delete it, or upload it to your private Sibme cloud Workspace or Huddle(s) you are participating in. Offline videos is a local Sibme library that is similar to your iOS camera roll. Your videos are stored on the device within the Sibme app.

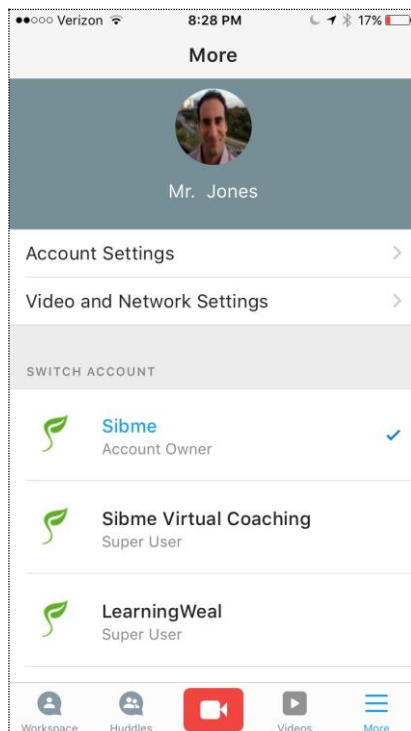
To access your recorded Sibme video from Offline videos, you must have a username/email and password. Anyone that logs into Sibme from an iPhone/iPad/iPod Touch that has the Sibme app can view previously recorded videos that have not been deleted.



6. It is recommended that after successfully uploading video(s) to the Sibme cloud (My Workspace and Huddles) that you delete these videos in "Offline Videos." The videos will take up storage space on your iOS device.

If your connection breaks while uploading over a strong wireless connection, your video will pause. You do not have to restart the video upload process from the beginning. If the video pauses during upload, click the play icon next to the right of the video thumbnail to resume upload.

7. You can adjust your recording resolution in Settings, turn off cellular data, and enable automatic upload. Once a video has stopped recording, it will save to Offline Videos and then automatically upload to your private workspace.



- 60 minute video recorded in High resolution (720p) is approximately 3 GB
- 60 minute video recorded in Medium (480p) is approximately 1 GB
- 60 minute video recorded in Low (320p) is approximately 300 - 400 MB
