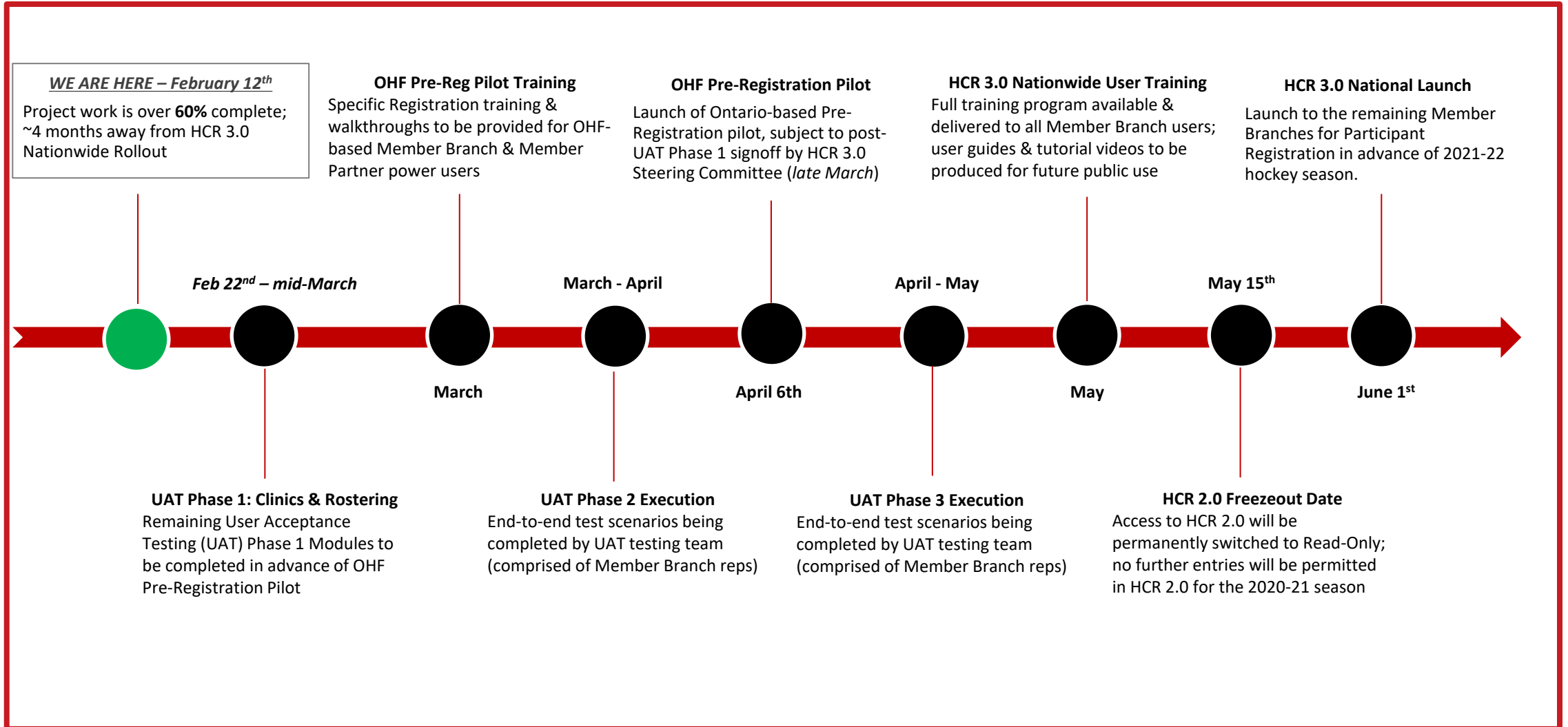
## HCR 3.0 Implementation Project

- Having selected **Spordle Inc.** as vendor of choice for developing & managing the new Hockey Canada Registry (HCR) 3.0 platform, a joint project team – consisting of resources from both Hockey Canada & Spordle – will be responsible for implementing the new platform in time for the 2021-22 minor hockey season
- Project Execution will also require input, involvement & participation from select Member Branch representatives, who will assist with completion of platform functionality testing and provide feedback on platform developments

## Why HCR 3.0?

- HCR 3.0 is intended to provide a significantly improved & streamlined end user experience for participant families registering in Hockey Canada-sanctioned programming
- The platform will also provide the organization with access to much higher quality data & trend analysis on participant figures, due to improvements in front end & back end platform capability

# HCR 2.0 to 3.0 Transition: Key Dates

## HCR 2.0 Freezeout – Saturday, May 15<sup>th</sup>

- All data & transactions related to the 2020-21 Season must be entered into HCR 2.0 on or before ***Saturday, May 15<sup>th</sup> @ 5 PM MST***, to ensure proper migration of data to HCR 3.0
- Once HCR 2.0 enters freezeout, access to HCR 2.0 will be fully restricted to **\*Read-Only\*** permission for **all users nationwide** (both at the Branch & MHA user levels)
- Requests for data pulls (beyond available basic reporting) from HCR 2.0 after May 15<sup>th</sup> must be submitted to the Hockey Canada HCR 3.0 Project Team; all requested pulls will be reviewed and completed by Hockey Canada staff on a case-by-case basis
- API Access in HCR 2.0 will be switched to **\*Pull-Only,\*** meaning third party applications will no longer be able to create new records or update existing records within HCR 2.0

## Pre-Registration for 2021-22 Season

- Aside from Ontario OHF Pre-Registration Pilot groups, MHAs will **not** be able to use HCR 2.0 for pre-registration for the 2021-22 season – data and records from the 2020-21 season will be the cutoff for migration to HCR 3.0
- If HCR remains the preferred choice for processing online registration for the 2021-22 season, MHAs must wait until nationwide launch of HCR 3.0 on June 1<sup>st</sup> to begin online registration activities
- However, there are still two options for “pre-registration” if required by Branches / MHAs:
  - 1) **Manual Pre-Registration:** Hockey Canada & Spordle will provide templates for recording 2021-22 pre-registration data in Excel, which can then be uploaded via .csv format to HCR 3.0 upon nationwide launch in June
  - 2) **Third Party Pre-Registration:** if an MHA uses a third party registration application, participants can still submit their signups for 2021-22 via the app; however, the data will effectively sit within the app until HCR 3.0 nationwide launch in June, at which point it will be pushed over to the new platform

# HCR 2.0 – Clarification on Use Cases

---

## 2021 Spring Hockey

- HCR 2.0 *will* be available to for Branches offering Spring Hockey programs, but the freezeout date will remain the same – all registration, rostering and transactions must be entered in HCR 2.0 on or before **Saturday, May 15<sup>th</sup> @ 5 PM MST**
- “Spring League” games can still be played after May 15<sup>th</sup>, but any further transactions or updates to records cannot occur within HCR 2.0 from that point onward
- If you intend to release players/participants at the conclusion of the Spring season, release actions also must be completed on or before May 15<sup>th</sup>, to ensure profiles are migrated properly to HCR 3.0

## HCR 3.0 API Connection for Third Party Platforms

- Branches & MHAs using third party apps & platforms for registration / team administration are still able to continue using them – *the end user experience will not change* once HCR 3.0 is launched
- Use of third party apps & platforms to remains at the discretion of Branches and their respective MHAs
- All third parties currently connected to HCR 2.0 via API will be connected to HCR 3.0 at launch – list found below:

# HCR 3.0 – Changes to Login Procedures

---

## Two-Factor Authentication (aka “2FA”)

- Administrative Users of HCR 3.0 will be required to use 2FA to log into the platform
  - Admin users are defined as anyone who can create or modify records to the HCR 3.0 database
  - Additional measure is intended to enhance the security of data residing within HCR 3.0
- Upon login, admins will need to retrieve & enter an additional code, sent to one of the following three provided contact details:
  - I. Cell phone via SMS Text
  - II. Authenticator App on Mobile Device
  - III. Secondary e-mail address
- 2FA will **\*not\*** be required for user login if the user does not have the ability to modify records
  - *Example: parents using HCR 3.0 only to register their children to programs will not be required to enable 2FA*

# HCR 3.0 – Changes to Login Procedures

---

## Account Locking

- Upon launch of HCR 3.0, User Accounts will now lock out after **3 incorrect login attempts**
  - This limit can be increased to 5 attempts if Members prefer a larger threshold; will confirm prior to HCR 3.0 launch
- Two options available for unlocking User Accounts for locked out users:
  - **Option 1:** All user unlock requests must receive signoff from the user's local Member Branch office
  - **Option 2:** Member Branch authorizes HCR Help Desk frontline staff to process "low risk" unlocks, pending review of user profile notes maintained on HCR 3.0 – if case isn't clear, HCR Help Desk escalates back to Member Branch office
  - *Member Branches will individually confirm their preference to Hockey Canada prior to HCR 3.0 launch*
- Admin User Accounts with no attempted logins *within the last 6 months* will be auto-suspended, *effective June 1<sup>st</sup>, 2021* (to align with HCR 3.0 nationwide launch)
  - Currently confirming approach with Member Branches; if any changes to proposed approach are required, we will update this communication with new details
