## Witches Skull

- Normal sponges
- Black never stain sponges
- BAM 1035 (heart swirls)
- Paradise ¾ " Prisma Brush (841)
- Paint pal (pink) ¾ " flat brush

- Paint pal Silly Farm Luxe Swirl #4
- Face Paint Forum Shop Holographic Chunky Silver Glitter
- Mama Clown white glitter dust

## Tips for working with kids

- Be sure to make the experience of the child getting face painted an interactive and memorable one by asking what colors and/or design they may want.
- Making sure that they are comfortable before starting to paint will help with the wiggles of a little one later.
- If they do need to get some wiggles out, have a short "dance break", which is a way for you both to shake it out and connect then get back to finishing the design.
- Be wary of the sensitive eye area. Use your discretion of which kids can handle paint around the eyes and which ones can not.
- If they ask to see what you are painting while you are painting, just tell them it would be no fun to ruin the surprise and that they will be able to take a look in the mirror as soon as the design is completed.

- When adding glitter be sure to tell the child to keep their eyes closed, no matter how far away you are from their eyes. Even cosmetic glitter is unpleasant when caught in the eye, so be cautious and avoid chunky glitter near the eyes as well.

## *Stencils*

- Stencils are a great way to add more detail and texture to a design, especially when on the job!
- Stencils can be used with paint or powders or even glitter sometimes.
- When using stencils with paint be sure that your sponge is nearly dry. If the sponge can be squeezed and water and paint drips from it, it is too wet. To check the consistency of the paint, tap your loaded sponge on the back of your hand first then tap on the desired area of your stencils.
- When using stencils with powders use a foam blender of your choice with pressed powders. Swirl your foam blender in the color of your choice then go back and forth over your stencil for desired coverage.

## *Create new versions of old designs*

- When thinking of creating new Halloween designs of your own, don't fret!
- Taking classic designs that you are already accustomed to painting (ie: skulls, butterflies, & princesses) and adding a Halloween themed element is the way to go.
- This can be done by using colors that fit the "Bootiful" Halloween theme such as orange, black, green and purple. You can also think of Halloween costumes for inspiration as well to keep things fresh!
- Creating your own Halloween designs is all about creativity and confidence, and I know that each of you reading this have an abundance of both of those things! I can't wait to see what everyone paints!
