

Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) Program

Thank you for your interest in the Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) Program. The mission of the Nursing program is to "develop knowledgeable, caring, principled nurses with a commitment to excellence by delivering the highest quality, holistic care to diverse patient populations." The BSN Program is structured as a 2+2 program, consisting of 60 credits of prerequisites and 60 credits of core nursing courses. Nursing students attend the Core full-time over four consecutive 16-week terms with one week off in-between terms. At the end of the program, students who are successful will be awarded a Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) degree. This education provides an opportunity for graduates to take the licensure exam, the NCLEX-RN. The Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) Degree Program at Hodges University has been approved by the Florida Board of Nursing, the Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing (ACEN), and the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges (SACSCOC). Hodges University is also accredited by SACSCOC.

The Nursing core is academically challenging and rigorous; students must earn a B or higher in ALL core nursing (NUR) courses. It is also time consuming. Students need to be on campus at least three evenings a week for class every semester. Clinicals take place on weekend days. Clinical sites are located in Naples, Fort Myers, and the surrounding area. Additionally, it is essential that students have access to a reliable computer with internet access and be computer proficient as all of the nursing classes contain an online component.

Application Process

Below you will find information concerning the separate application process for the Nursing Core. Students can apply to the Nursing Core after they have met certain criteria and successfully completed at least 50% of the theorem the courses. These criteria include:

- Submission of an application to Hodges University
- A GPA of 2.75 for all of the courses in the pre-Nursing Core
- A grade of C or better in all courses
- A composite score of 65 or higher in the ATI Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS) Exam Send a copy

Students who have met all these entry requirements may submit the required secondary application to the Nursing Program. Once the secondary application and the TEAS Exam results have been received, the secondary admissions process will be initiated. This includes:

- A review of all applications by the nursing program.
- Consideration of the following Selection Factors:

In addition to the minimum admission requirements, the following factors may also be considered:

- Community service, such as volunteer activities, especially in health-related areas.
- Extracurricular activities.
- Awards and honors for academic achievement, leadership, and community service.

- Veterans.
- Academic histories and GPAs, with special consideration to the following:
 - ❖ A grade of B or higher in science courses completed.
 - ❖ The number of course hours successfully carried each semester.
 - The number of course failures and the dates of those failures.
 - The types of courses failed.
 - The number of times a course was repeated.
 - The number of withdrawals in comparison to hours enrolled.
 - The number of withdrawal repetitions and the dates of those withdrawals

Students are notified in writing of their admission status by the Director of Nursing after all applications have been reviewed. If accepted, prospective students will be **conditionally** admitted pending their Level II Criminal Background Check with finger printing, a physical examination, immunization record documentation, drug screening, and final grades.
