

American Socialism: Too Much, Too Little, or Just Right?

With Charles Kupechella, PhD

This lecture/discussion begins with a review of how the word, "socialism" was hijacked and corrupted

by Marx and Lenin and became a bad, dirty word.....when the real meaning of the word — disassociated from such things as totalitarianism, state-ownership of the means of production, and communism — can be very positive. With its nearly 90 Federal social programs having a price-tag approaching a trillion dollars annually, the USA is, and has been a socialist country for 100 years. A few examples: Social Security, Medicaid, Medicare, Pell Grants, agricultural price-supports and subsidies, school-lunch programs, senior centers, Job-Corps, public-housing, Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (and corporations) and the Peace Corps. This presentation includes a review of how the USA compares to other "socialist" countries of the world.

Charles E. Kupchella, PhD, served as a Professor of Biology at seven American Universities and is a past-president of the University of North Dakota, and a past-president of the American Association for Cancer Education. He is the author of 50 published articles, most of them in scientific periodicals, and six books on cancer, the environment and other topics, including the most recent, "The Tree Shack: A Story about the Foundations of Morality and the Origins of Humankind," a work of fiction published in 2014 (available from Amazon) and a soon to be out work of non-fiction: Morality: How it Evolved and how it was Hijacked and Confounded by Religion.
