

Economic Nationalism, Globalism, and the Rise of China

With Richard Price

By way of contrast, Richard will introduce the post WW2 rise of the United States and its contributions, the institutions that have been created, and how we manage this from a global perspective as a segue to China. He will review the modern history of China from 1842 to today (crucial to understanding China), and then launch into the BRI (belt and road initiative) and modern China. He will review some selected projects to provide context and describe both strategy and funding.

Richard Price has made numerous presentations to a variety of venues on a wide range of subjects including The Patriot Act, the Israeli Nation-State bill, Introduction to Behavioral Economics, Introduction to Quantum Computing, Topics related to China and others. His approach is based on the importance of communicating from a layperson perspective, in understanding the broad issues and potential impact of those issues, reflecting an apolitical standpoint (as much as possible).

Richard holds a Bachelors' degree in Math and MBA, has served in the military as a volunteer. He comes from both a High Tech and small business background and throughout his working career exhibited deep interest in technical/scientific issues and current events.
