- Some assignments specifically want opinion essays; some don't—be sure to know what is the nature of the assignment: essay, or research, or combination. If not sure, ask the instructor.

- Expository Report, teach, explain, inform
- Descriptive Paint a picture, create images



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- Narrative Tell a story (Characters, Conflict, Resolution)
- Personal University application personal statement
- Hybrid combining one or more of these general types.

Classical Invention Skills

- Division (Things about, topics pertaining to)
- Comparison (What is this like? How so?)
- Application (To whom or in what circumstance does this apply: Who Cares?)
- Significance (Value, impact, causes, effects, meaning, significance: So What?)

- Mechanically, this paper should be flawless.




1. Find something that he or she wrote.





- 1. Find something that he or she wrote.
- 2. Figure out his or her writing style, and make a list of things done—or never done. Some possibilities:
 - Average words/¶ (longest, shortest)
 - Average words/sentence
 - Longest/Shortest sentence
 - Frequency of openers, decorations
 - Favorite words
 Conventions
 - Use of triple patterns




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- 3. Use that checklist to write each paragraph of every paper.
- 4. Get a better grade from that teacher!


