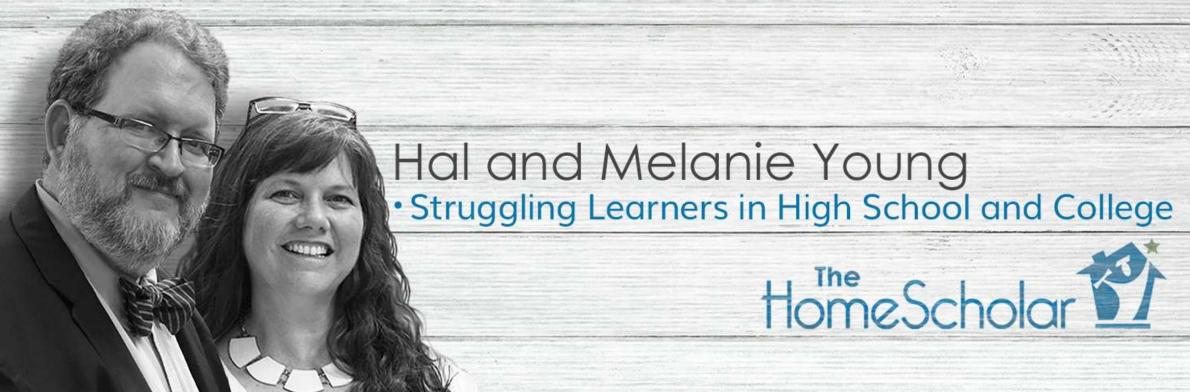

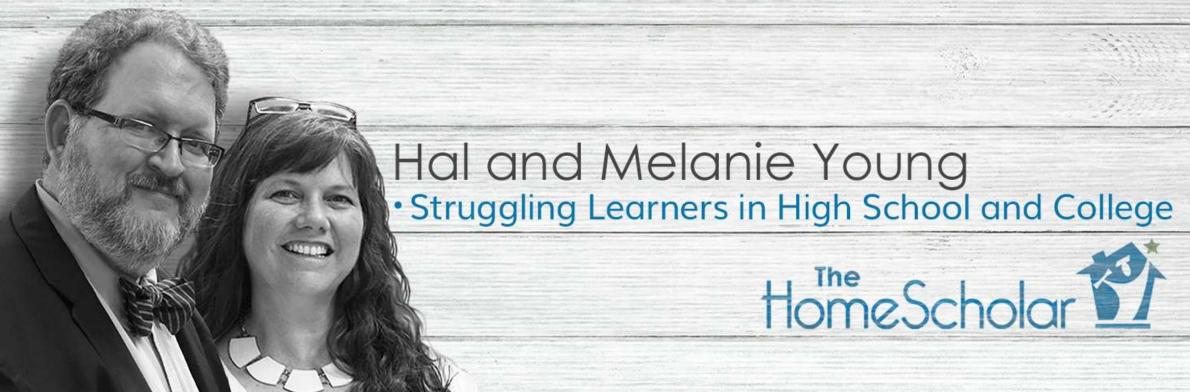

Getting Up to Speed

- o Get into college prep coursework audio, dictating, accommodate!
- o Don't aim too low
- Get them tested educational psychologist, be sure to mention to them any previous testing so they can reference it.
- Write up educational plan reference testing, write out accommodations (timing, dictating, etc)



Getting it Done

- o Shore up weaknesses
- o Focus on strengths
 - o Encourage experimentation
 - o Businesses, projects, internships, shadowing
- o Accommodate, accommodate, accommodate
- o Encourage, praise, help





Extracurriculars and Outside Classes

- o Private heads up and request accommodations
- o Make it easy for them help
- o Essential to get academic recommendations
- o Don't fear!
- Think through extracurriculars nametags, registration, reading, writing
- o Recommendation letters should give examples

SAT and ACT Accommodations

- o You're the teacher, the guidance counselor.
- o You'll Need
 - The correct form requesting accommodations.
 - o Up-to-date testing by an educational psychologist.
 - o An educational plan showing accommodations.
 - For the ACT, signature of nearby school's testing coordinator
 - o To work with the guidance counselor
 - o Patience!



SAT and ACT Accommodations

- o Accommodations Possible:
 - o Extended time: 50%, 100%
 - o Computer instead of writing, scribe
 - o Large print, reader
 - o Smaller group, more breaks (coach them to accept!)
- o May test on different day. Call in advance!



SAT and ACT Accommodations

- o What if school won't help?
 - o School board
 - Services for Students with Disabilities office at testing agency
 - o Try another school
- Communication Essential
 - o Assume balls will be dropped
 - o Be polite, but persistent (ADA)



Transcripts

- o Short and sweet: one page, front only
- o Say it like they expect to hear it
- o Administrator signs
- o Organize chronologically or by subject
- o Grades are your decision
 - Don't be harsher than others
 - Base on tests, daily work, lab reports, presentations, discussion, whatever best shows your student's knowledge!
- Sample transcript



Applying to College

- o Research colleges Safety, Matches, Reach
- o How many? More than you think. (money, major)
- o Dictating, scribes for applications, essays
- o To reveal or not?
- o Scholarship deadlines are earlier
- o Expect it to take way more time than you think



The Essay

- Your introduction to the committee
- o Decide what you want them to know about you
- o Tell a story
- o Don't be trite
- o Don't be afraid Get help

- o Contact Disability Support Services
- o Be professional
- o Bring data
- o Don't be antagonistic
- o Ask questions
- o College visit





Kinds of Accommodations at College

- o Private testing
- o Extended time on assignments and testing
- o Scribe (limited) or computer
- o Audiobooks
- o Tutors
- o Spelling aids
- o Overlook grammar and spelling
- o Student to take notes for you

At College



When You Get There

- o Develop relationships
 - o Disability Services
 - o Professors
- Ask about professors
- o BEFORE Drop/Add Date
 - o Talk to professor about accommodations
 - o Emphasize desire to learn and participate
 - o Talk to Disability Services
 - o Be proactive



Problem Professors

- o It happens
- o Change sections if you can
- o Ask Disability Services for help
- o Rely on Resources
 - o SI
 - o Tutors
 - o Office Hours
- o Endure and Accept or Get Permission to Drop



Day to Day Life

- o Work may take more time than others
- Have a back up plan for editing help (parent, sibling, tutor, friend)
- o Get enough rest
- o Privacy should be protected
- o Get involved in clubs and activities
- o Make church and Christian groups an absolute priority

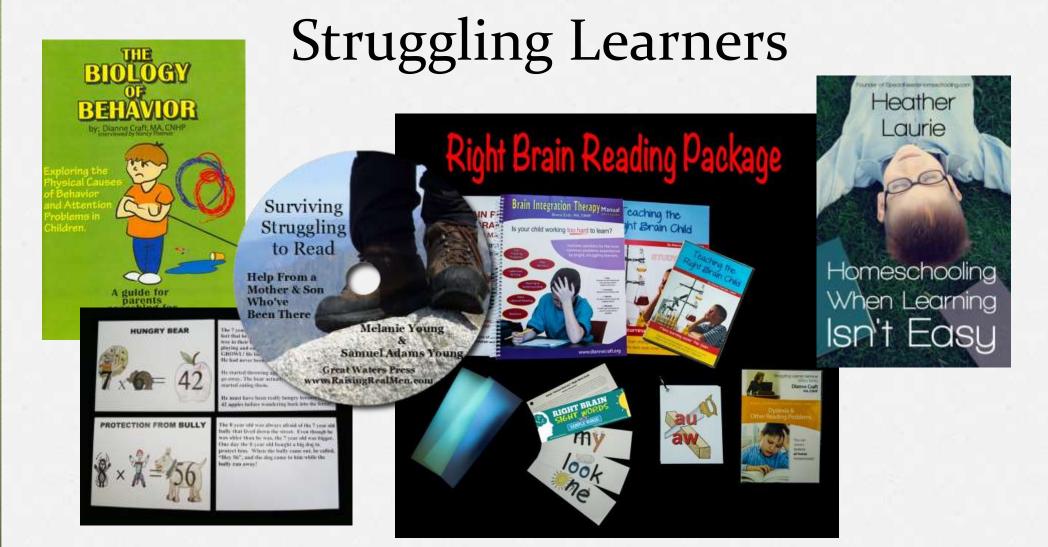


Thrive
