Today is the first Sunday of a new year, and it's always a strange moment. The calendar changes, the pace slows just enough for us to notice, and we realize again how quickly time moves. Another year has closed. Another one has begun.

2025 was not without its difficulties, but it also carried many good gifts—moments of growth, progress, restoration, and grace. We step into 2026 in a world that still feels uncertain and unfinished, yet filled with new opportunities and fresh mercies. And here at Hoover, we begin this year with genuine gratitude. We're thankful for the ways God has been at work among us, encouraged by the unity of our church family, and hopeful as we prepare to welcome a new Youth Minister into our life together next month.

In the years ahead, what will you remember about 2025?

Political tension that still shapes much of our public life. Rising costs that affect families in real and daily ways. Rapid change in technology, culture, and expectations. A sense that the world is moving fast, and not always in the direction we might choose.

As we begin 2026, this is a good time not only to think about what we hope for, but to consider carefully how we should pray. The passing of a year has a way of reminding us that much of life is beyond our control, and that our truest stability doesn't come from circumstances at all.

So we pray.

- We pray for wisdom: for those who lead, for those who serve, for those who teach, and for ourselves . . . that we would make good decisions, speak with grace, and walk faithfully before our God.
- We pray that God will continue shaping us through whatever this year brings, teaching us patience, deepening our trust, strengthening our character, and sharpening our love for one another.
- We pray for peace in a divided world, and for the quiet work of Christ to heal what is broken, soften what is hardened, and steady what is afraid, beginning with us.
- We pray for those whose faith feels tired, whose joy has grown thin, or whose hope needs fresh breath.
- We pray that the church will be what God intends it to be—not perfect, but faithful; not driven by fear, but marked by love and steady obedience.
- We pray for those entering this year with burdens: illness, grief, financial pressure, loneliness, unanswered questions, or private struggles known only to God.
- And above all, we pray that in 2026 God will be glorified in us: that our lives will reflect the goodness of Christ, that doors will open for the gospel, and that many will come to know the hope that only he can give.

We don't know what this year will hold. But we begin it with steady confidence in the One who does. And because our future rests in his hands, we step into 2026 not with anxiety, but with a quiet and patient hope. —Chuck

Christ is the Center, Focus, and Key

Let us not forget the reason the Bible was written and preserved: "that you may know that you have eternal life" (1 John 5:13). Christ is the **center, focus, and key** to the inspiration and interpretation of the Bible. This is why the books of the Old and New Testament fit together so well into one cohesive and comprehensive whole. Taken together, they present the progressive unfolding, revelation, and communication of Christ.

1. The Law (Genesis-Deuteronomy) prepares the ground or base on which the moral system of Christ rests. It is the beginning or first principles of the system of truth. Christ is the ultimate foundation of all that is right (1 Corinthians 3:11).

2. The History section (Joshua-Esther) shows the preparation for Christ. History, from an inerrant biblical perspective, holds true the necessity of righteousness and faith (2 Timothy 3:16).

3. Poetry (Job-Song of Solomon) expresses an aspiration for Christ the Savior. Seeing the scripture is nothing less than the words of our very Creator, it is no wonder that throughout the centuries men and women have been astonished by it. David said, "The law of the Lord is perfect" (Psalm 19:7).

4. Prophecy (Isaiah-Malachi) proclaims an expectation of Christ. The Bible is the account of redemption, how God rescues men from sin and from death.

5. The Gospel Records (Matthew-John) relate the historical manifestation of Christ. They are true accounts of the work and the acts of Christ the Son of God (John 20:30-31).

6. Acts relates the propagation of the gospel of Christ. It portrays the resurrected Christ on His ascension, by the Spirit, through the disciples, for the producing of the church—the kingdom of God.

7. The Epistles (Romans-Jude) give the interpretation of Christ. The epistles answer questions asked by the church or address problems within the church.

8. Revelation describes the consummation of all things in Christ. The second coming of Christ marks the time when the church goes home for eternity.

How is it that every part of the Bible, in spite of its great diversity, can contribute to its overarching theme of redemption and its central figure, the Christ? How? Because it is from God!

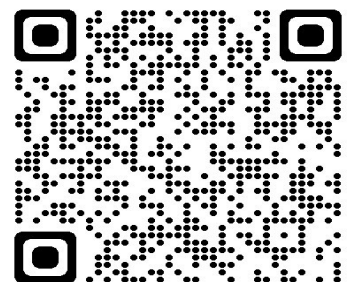

Any of our members who have struggled with loss are invited to participate in our **GriefShare** class. If you have friends who might benefit, please let them know about this class as well. **We will meet on the following Saturdays from 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon: December 13, March 14, and June 13.**

So many people in the world have experienced significant losses in their lives, so we're thankful to be able to offer this GriefShare Ministry. It is organized around a thirteen-week small-group program where participants meet together for around two hours each week and watch professionally-designed videos featuring professional grief counselors and also people who are grieving. These presentations are coupled with discussions that are designed to internalize what participants learn in the videos.
