His good pleasure

It's clear that God expects a human response in our relationship to him, but do we sometimes emphasize what we do above what he's doing? It's important to recognize that God's saving us begins, continues, and ends with his initiative, not ours.

Notice how Paul mentions both in this passage:

Therefore, my beloved, as you have always obeyed, so now, not only as in my presence but much more in my absence, work out your own salvation with fear and trembling, for it is God who works in you, both to will and to work for his good pleasure (Philippians 2:12-13).

It's a play on words, one scholar says: We are to "work out" because God "works in" (R.R. Melick).

I've done—and you've heard—a lot of preaching on the "working out" part, but maybe not as much on God's "working in."

Perhaps that's part of the reason we often struggle to feel truly secure in our salvation. We know, more than anyone else (except God), how far short we fall of being who we ought to be. If it depends on our efforts, we know we'll miss out on salvation—even if we don't like to admit it.

On the other hand, when we recognize that God is working in us "to will and to work for his good pleasure," it directs our focus *God*ward, instead of *in*ward.

That's where we find comfort. I'll always fall short, but he won't.

In another place Paul wrote this: "So then it depends not on human will or exertion, but on God, who has mercy" (Romans 9:16). There's a reluctance to embrace this, because we fear that emphasizing what God is doing will cause us to relax . . . to fall into spiritual apathy. But I think we'll find that it'll do the opposite.

Maybe when we put more trust in God's power to accomplish in us whatever he chooses, we'll find ourselves obeying more faithfully out of gratitude, instead of some kind of misguided attempt to earn what we can never earn.

It ought to comfort us in a way that our attempts to measure up never can—God, who loves us infinitely and wants to save us, is working within us to accomplish his will.

Do we obey? Absolutely.

But we do it in response to what he's already done, and what he continues to do.

Things that matter . . . that we will be proud to have accomplished . . . take time and work. To succeed in the important areas of life, we need interest, heart, enthusiasm, and eagerness. Emerson said, "What lies behind us and what lies before us are tiny matters compared to what lies within us." It's usually pretty fair to assume that you won't meet many of your lofty goals if the determination within you doesn't move you to act persistently.

The line between enthusiasm and apathy is very fine, and it's amazing how quickly and often we jump over it and back again. I like to daydream that there are hundreds of careers or lifestyles that I would be happy in. I imagine that in another life I might have sailed the seven seas, been a trapper/tanner/falconer in Alaska, or joined my countrymen and women at arms in the military. But I'm DOING what I have passion for. I'm not any of those other things because I was and am most interested and eager to minister to young people and their families (And it's hard to catch a falcon). So, where would you honestly say your level of zeal for Christ is taking you? If you took the level of enthusiasm you have for Jesus, and applied it to even your favorite hobby, how good would you be at it? We have heard the verses: "Seek ye first the kingdom of God and His righteousness . . ." (Matthew 6:33, etc.). But, we also know that it's a daily challenge to lay aside everything else that vies for the number one place in our hearts (Hebrews 12:1).

Apathy wars against the thoughts and intents of the heart. Indifference is one of the great weapons the deceiver wields against the pure-hearted. Your eagerness and enthusiasm are needed in your journey to be with God for eternity. The heart that is in you now is more powerful and important than the successes or failures of your past or future. Give that whole heart to God.
