Genuinely concerned

Maybe you've heard the story about what some of the unbelievers were saying about Christians during the time of Roman persecution.

"See how they love one another."

They were confused by some of the things that Christians believed, but they couldn't deny their compassion.

That's one of the neatest things about being in God's family: people who genuinely, deeply, selflessly care about one another.

Apparently this attitude was embodied in Timothy, Paul's protégé in ministry. Read carefully what Paul wrote about him:

I hope in the Lord Jesus to send Timothy to you soon, so that I too may be cheered by news of you. For I have no one like him, who will be genuinely concerned for your welfare. For they all seek their own interests, not those of Jesus Christ. But you know Timothy's proven worth, how as a son with a father he has served with me in the gospel. I hope therefore to send him just as soon as I see how it will go with me, and I trust in the Lord that shortly I myself will come also (Philippians 2:19-24).

I love this statement: He "will be genuinely concerned for your welfare."

Paul wasn't one to flatter, so Timothy's compassion must've been real. He could be trusted completely. Paul didn't have to worry about any kind of personal agenda or self-promotion.

He genuinely cared.

Really, that's what the church is, isn't it?

In a dog-eat-dog world where people are often viewed as little more than stepping stones on an upward career path, the church is refreshing.

In a culture where so many relationships are guided more by "What can I get out of it?" than by true love, real selflessness is impressive.

Like Timothy, Christians are "genuinely concerned" for one another's welfare. We feel pain when someone else hurts, and we smile when a fellow Christian rejoices.

I think that's what'll make our evangelistic efforts work. People don't know—and don't care—what we believe about various doctrines, but they'll notice the compassion.

"See how they love one another."

Churches full of Timothys are still doing God's work.

Mighty to Save

"Savior, He can move the mountains. My God is mighty to save. He is mighty to save. Forever, author of salvation, He rose and conquered the grave. Jesus conquered the grave." God has used these words to speak hope into our family several times through the years. They are lyrics to the song, Mighty to Save, by Ben Fielding and Reuben Morgan. I want to share some of these "little" moments that have been meaningful to us. Maybe they'll bless you in some way.

When Eli was little, we read a Bible story about remaining steadfast through trials, and during the Q&A portion, he asked, "When is God going to move the mountains in my life?" Later, when a friend's brother was dying, and we were so worried about him, but also that the tragedy might ruin any hope we had for our friend's soul. Suddenly, we heard Eli's sweet little voice singing, "Savior, He can move the mountains. My God is mighty to save. He is mighty to save." God did move that mountain, by the way.

Little Eden loved to sing and would ask, "You want me to sing a nudder song?"
Mighty to Save was one of her favorites for a while. But her version was a little different. She would sing "He rose and conquered today. Jesus conquered today." It sure seemed like she would often sing those words at just the right times. When a day would feel like it had conquered us, the reminder that Jesus had already conquered this day and every day was comforting.

Most recently, Chet and I were talking about the idea of God moving mountains. He thought for a moment and asked, "When God moves a mountain, can you see it move or does He move it so slowly that you don't know it's moving?"

While we can't know God's timing, we can be sure He is always with us and always working for our good. I'm so happy when I see my children's minds stuck on the greatness and mighty works of God. I hope they will always look at the mountains in their lives with the expectation that God will move them if they need to be moved.
