Time

I don't have time.

I say those words a lot, and there's nothing inherently wrong with them. All of us have to make choices with our time.

I think the issue is what we say those words about. And who we say them to.

Paul addresses the principle here:

Look carefully then how you walk, not as unwise but as wise, making the best use of the time, because the days are evil (Ephesians 5:15-16).

How we spend our time reflects our priorities.

"I don't have enough time" is really saying that we've got something else to do that's more important. Again, there's nothing necessarily wrong with that, but we ought to recognize what we're saying.

If I tell my son I don't have time to play ball with him, what I'm really saying is that I'm choosing to do something else.

If we don't take time to work on our marriages, or read and pray, or attend church services, it really isn't that we don't have time.

It's a matter of priorities.

Ask God to help you look at your time. Ask him to convict you of those time leaks that are stealing from more important things. Ask him to give you the wisdom to say "yes" to what really counts and "no" to what doesn't.

He's giving you 24 hours today, and tomorrow, and you'll make dozens of choices concerning what to do with them.

Maybe you've got chores to do, or some work to catch up on, or some reading for a test, but somewhere in there is some negotiable time—time that'll point out your priorities.

It might be you need to use some of that time to be with your spouse.

Maybe you need to play with your kids.

Perhaps some time to commune with the Lord.

One day.

Twenty-four hours.

One thousand four hundred forty minutes.

May God be glorified in our time every day.

Tangled

"Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles. And let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us" (Hebrews 12:1). The word translated "entangled" here comes from a word that means, "that which easily encircles or entangles, like a loose flowing robe." Runners in the ancient Olympics would lay their robes aside so they wouldn't get tangled up in them. Sin has the tendency to trip us up by wrapping around us in a way that make our fall feel uncontrollable.

When we serve others, don't we do it because we believe we are serving Christ himself (Matthew 25)? We also give because we believe we will be blessed in doing so (Luke 6:38). When we submit to water baptism, aren't we doing it because we believe it's necessary for our sins to be washed away? When we open our mouths to teach others about Christ, don't we do so with faith that God will give the increase and add souls to His church those whom He is saving?

Isn't the converse true, then? When I "know the right thing to do, but choose not to do it" (James 4:17), it's based in part on the fact that I have trouble believing God will keep his promises. I don't like admitting this, but there's a measure of disbelief that is always lurking in the shadows, and it is sometimes responsible for my disobedience to God.

But with our imperfect faith, we cry out to God, "I believe, but help me in my unbelief" (Mark 9:24). God is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine. According to HIS power that is at work within us (Ephesians 3:20)! He can take our mustard seed sized faith and exceed all our expectations. If you're tangled in a web of disbelief and other sin, cast those things aside and lean on Him.
