Your heart

Once God grabs us, he wants us all.

He's not satisfied with just our heads, our intellect, though he wants that too.

He wants our wills, but more than that.

He's concerned about our walk—what we do—but again, he doesn't stop there.

He wants our hearts, our emotions, our feelings.

In fact, Paul writes that one of the first signs that Jesus has truly become our Lord is when our hearts become his:

"Put on then, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, compassionate hearts, . . ." (Colossians 3:12).

He'd just written that Christians have to get rid of some old attitudes and practices—sexual immorality, anger, dishonesty, obscene speech.

But it's not enough for our Christianity to be defined by what we don't do. Too often we're known more by what we're against than what we're for.

So Paul counterbalances his discussion on getting rid of sin by emphasizing what needs to replace those bad habits.

And first on his list is compassionate hearts.

Because the Lord now rules our lives, his heart becomes ours as our hearts become his.

The "Father of mercies and God of all comfort" sympathizes with us in our weakness, so we extend that compassion to the people around us.

What this means practically is that we care about people, and we're especially sympathetic when they're hurting.

It means our Christianity is often seen more clearly in hospitals than it is in the sanctuary.

Some weeks you'll do more Christ-following at the funeral home on Thursday than you'll do in the church building on Sunday.

An uncompassionate Christian is an oxymoron. It just doesn't work like that.

God does indeed want all of us, including our hearts.

Especially our hearts. —Chuck

Will We Know Anyone in Heaven?

Anyone who has lost a loved one is interested in knowing the answer to this question. Every person will one day face death and needs assurance of heaven. All of us hope to be reunited with loved ones who have gone on before, but if we will not know each other in heaven, then the bonds made on earth are forever severed in death.

The idea that we will know each other in heaven is sometimes called the doctrine of "future recognition." It is both reasonable and scriptural. If we know anything in heaven, we will surely know that we are in heaven. We must know ourselves, unless we lose all personal identity and recognition in death. Surely, we will know Christ, and that He has redeemed us from our sins, thus allowing us to enjoy the rewards of heaven. If we will know we are in heaven, know who we are, know Christ, and know that He rewards us for our faithfulness, surely, we will know one another.

Revelation 6:9-10 describes a scene under the altar of God. The souls of the martyrs, "slain for the word of God and for the testimony which they held," cried out for vengeance. These martyrs retained their personalities in the death state, were conscious of where they were, and knew why they were there. They knew that they had been murdered and were conscious that their murderers had not been punished. Surely, they knew each other.

The story we know as "The Rich Man and Lazarus" is found in Luke 16:19-31. Whether this is a parable or not, it still indicates much about the state of the dead. The characters were all conscious and aware of their surroundings, and all possessed a memory of the world they had left. Abraham told the rich man to "remember." He could remember because he was conscious of who he was, where he was, and who the others were. We also have the example of Moses and Elijah at the Mount of Transfiguration (Matthew 17:1-5). The apostles recognized them, so they had not lost their identity in death.

There will be no giving and taking in marriage in heaven as there is on earth (Luke 20:35–36), and many other things will be changed in heaven. But we will know one another, and heaven will be much better than we can imagine. The key is to be prepared to go to heaven by obeying the will of God because heaven is a prepared place for prepared people (John 14:1-3).

GriefShare Ministry

Back in the Spring we finished our first **GriefShare Group**, and we believe God used our time together to bless everyone who attended. As we move forward, we're planning to make this ministry available to people outside of our congregation—whether they're followers of Jesus or not. We believe that God might use us to help people in our community to realize how much God loves them and how he wants to care for them in their time of grief.

We're looking forward to beginning a new group on Saturday, October 1, from 10-12, and we'll meet every Saturday at the same time, finishing on December 31. If you're struggling with grief, please plan to be a part of this new group. If you have a friend, family member, neighbor, or co-worker who you think might benefit from attending, please let them know about this ministry. We would welcome them.

This ministry is organized around a thirteen-week small-group program where participants meet together for around two hours each week and watch professionally-designed videos featuring professional grief counselors as well as people who are grieving. These presentations are coupled with discussions that are designed to internalize what participants learn in the videos.
