Citizens

Politics is never very far from many Americans' thoughts . . . discussions permeate online chatter, not to mention the 24/7 news cycle. Nearly everyone has a (strongly held and loudly vocalized) opinion.

Probably all of us need this reminder from Paul.

Only let your manner of life be worthy of the gospel of Christ, so that whether I come and see you or am absent, I may hear of you that you are standing firm in one spirit, with one mind striving side by side for the faith of the gospel (Philippians 1:27).

It won't jump out at you in the ESV above, but there are a couple of translations that bring out the nuances of a word that Paul intentionally used.

"Whatever happens, as citizens of heaven live in a manner worthy of the gospel of Christ" (TNIV).

"Above all, you must live as citizens of heaven, conducting yourselves in a manner worthy of the Good News about Christ" (NLT).

The key word there is citizens. Paul used a word that meant "to live as a citizen."

People who lived in Philippi were extremely pleased with their Roman citizenship. It gave them all kinds of rights that non-citizens didn't have, so naturally it was a matter of great pride to them.

Paul nudges them gently: "Remember," he says, "your most important citizenship is in heaven, so be sure to live consistently with the gospel."

In other words, don't let your Roman pride trump your kingdom citizenship.

I think that's a needed reminder for us. Politics gets ugly sometimes—lines are drawn, convictions are trumpeted, and identities are formed.

"I'm a Republican!" one shouts, while another points to his allegiance to the Democratic Party. Maybe it isn't the case, but sometimes it seems that one's political party is about the most important thing there is.

If Paul were writing a letter to us today, he might say something like this:

"Remember who you really are. You may be an American who loves your country, but please remember that above all else you're a Christian. So don't let the ugliness and divisiveness of politics cause you to misrepresent what it means to follow Jesus."

There are serious issues at stake in our country, and sometimes God gives us opportunities to express our biblical and moral convictions in ways that honor him.

But let's never allow our political passion to outshout and overshadow the Lord we follow.

We are and will always be citizens of God's kingdom first.

During a terrible storm on the ocean, a small passenger ship rolled precariously in the roaring tempest. The furniture and anything else that could move was tied down, and the passengers were confined to their bunks for their own safety. Many on board thought the vessel was doomed.

Finally, a passenger who was determined to find out if there was any hope for survival, set out to see the one who was in command. Clinging to the walls and handrails, he made his way to the wave-lashed deck, up a ladder, and into the wheelhouse. He noticed that the ship was nearing land and was between some jagged rocks. It became apparent that the captain was trying to reach the safety of a calm bay up ahead. Knowing he could not make himself heard above the roar of the wind and waves, the captain just turned wordlessly to the worried passenger and smiled. Reassured, the man returned to the others and said, "Don't be afraid. All is well. I've seen the captain's face, and he smiled!"

When we are battered by the storms of life, we may be tempted to give in to feelings of hopelessness. But if we will look to our sovereign Captain (Hebrews 2:10) and commit our way to Him (Psalm 37:5), we will find peace even in the midst of great turmoil. We can trust Him to bring us through the storm (Mark 4:36-41).
