Close to God

I can't imagine what it'll be like to stand in God's presence, but I'm pretty sure it'll be the best thing about heaven.

What will it feel like?

What will he look like?

What will it be like?

I want that. But I'm not ready for it yet. People can't be in the presence of God—not actually, not yet. We wouldn't survive it.

Whenever God revealed himself in Scripture—even in a limited way—he always warned people to prepare so they could live through the encounter. After the Israelites left Egypt, God met them at Sinai to give his law, but he didn't simply stroll down the mountain and chat. He told Moses to consecrate the people for two days, have them wash their clothes, and be ready the third day. Then he drew a boundary: don't come too close. Cross it, and you die.

That's how it's always been. We can't come close to God because of our sins. Something has to happen—some cleansing, some atonement—before sinners can enter God's presence.

That's why these simple words from James stop me in my tracks: "Draw near to God, and he will draw near to you" (James 4:8).

Us? Draw near to God? How?

Through Jesus. He cleanses us, makes us holy, and grants us access to God. The torn veil at Jesus's crucifixion shouted the good news: the barrier is gone. The way is open.

But James doesn't let us rush in casually. Right after he tells us to draw near, he adds: "Cleanse your hands, you sinners, and purify your hearts, you double-minded. Be wretched and mourn and weep. . . . Humble yourselves before the Lord, and he will exalt you" (James 4:8-10).

Yes, we're forgiven. Yes, God welcomes us. But drawing near still involves repentance. It still involves remembering who we are and who he is.

We feel that every week at the Lord's Table. We don't deserve to commune with Christ, yet he invites us to sit and eat with him. And as we draw near, we remember—our sins, our failures, our wandering hearts. The times we've lost focus, spoken harshly, or acted selfishly. We draw near with gratitude, but also with humility.

And as we draw near now with repentance, one day we'll draw near with no barriers at all. No sinful flesh. No brokenness. No veil. Nothing but his immeasurable holiness and light.

We'll bask in it forever.

5. Perish (Acts 8:20).
6. Cause a brother to fall (Romans 14:13).
7. Become disqualified (1 Corinthians 9:27).
8. Leave the faith (2 Corinthians 13:5).
9. Fall from grace (Galatians 5:4).
10. Be deceived by false teachers (Ephesians 4:14).
11. Become enemies of Christ (Philippians 3:18).
12. Move away from the hope of the gospel (Colossians 1:23).
13. Die from not standing fast in the Lord (1 Thessalonians 3:8).
14. Be deceived and damned (2 Thessalonians 2:3-12).
15. Put away the faith and be delivered to Satan (1 Timothy 1:19-20).
16. Err concerning the truth and be overthrown (2 Timothy 2:18).
17. Turn from the truth and deny God (Titus 1:14-16).
18. Have ineffective faith by failing to acknowledge Christ (Philemon 1:6).
19. Draw back to perdition (Hebrews 10:38-39).
20. Fall into judgment (James 5:12).
21. Be devoured by Satan (1 Peter 5:8).
22. Be led away by error and fall (2 Peter 3:17)
23. Disobey and not have the truth (1 John 2:4-5)


