Our congregation—along with the Palisades, Decatur Highway, and Ashville Road Churches of Christ—have raised \$49,620! It costs \$7,500 on average to dig one cleanwater well, so that gives us enough for six wells this year, which is incredible. If we raise \$2,880 more, we'll dig a seventh well. If not, Healing Hands will use the balance to go toward repairing existing wells. Either way, your generosity is amazing, and thousands of people will be blessed because of what you've done.
