### **Drifting**

One day my Dad and a fellow sailor went snorkeling off a Hawaiian beach when they were stationed there with the Navy.

They started following an exotic fish only to realize—almost too late—that they hadn't kept track of time or how far they'd gone. When Dad finally lifted his head out of the water, what he saw terrified him. The beach was so far away as to be hardly visible.

A few minutes of distraction almost cost them their lives, but both of them made it back safely . . . but barely.

It occurred to me that something similar often happens spiritually, but with much more tragic consequences. Have you ever watched someone walk away from God?

Occasionally, I suppose, it happens with one big splash, some kind of all-of-the-sudden loss of faith that leads to desertion. Maybe it's a catastrophe that creates doubt that wasn't there before, or at least wasn't recognizable.

But more often it happens differently. It begins slowly with a few tentative steps away from God. They're not noticeable at first, maybe not even to the one taking them.

If not corrected, however, a believer finds himself so far from shore that he no longer has the strength or will to make it back. That's why the Bible has warnings like this one:

Therefore we must pay much closer attention to what we have heard, lest we drift away from it. For since the message declared by angels proved to be reliable, and every transgression or disobedience received a just retribution, how shall we escape if we neglect such a great salvation? It was declared at first by the Lord, and it was attested to us by those who heard, while God also bore witness by signs and wonders and various miracles and by gifts of the Holy Spirit distributed according to his will (Hebrews 2:1-4).

Maybe our first tendency is to do what I did above—think about a friend or family member who's drifted.

But a more appropriate response is to look inward.

Some Christians let down their guard—not much, perhaps, and maybe no one else even knows. Just a little more relaxed attitude toward sins that used to bother them, or perhaps a lesser commitment to spiritual things like worship and prayer. Does that ever describe you?

"Pay much closer attention," the Bible warns, "lest you drift away."

Perhaps this passage should lead us today to conduct a sort of spiritual checkup.

How's my relationship with Jesus? How's my devotional life? How am I treating people?

Is my worship spontaneous and sincere or rote and ritualistic? We all go through spiritual down times, of course, and being at a low point doesn't mean we've lost our faith.

But it probably means that we need to look back toward the Lord, pray to him, and ask him to turn our hearts toward him again. The best time to stop a drift is soon after it starts, before it gathers momentum.

If you look around today and notice signs of distraction, turn back quickly. Don't let yourself get too far away from shore. That can be deadly.

#### As You Are Going

In Luke 9, Jesus sent his followers out to the towns and villages to teach the gospel and to heal. These disciples had been following Jesus every day and watching Him do the impossible. They'd been listening to the perfect words of the Messiah. The comfortable thing might have been for the disciples to stick like glue to Jesus' side, to be adored by the crowds, and to tell exciting stories about their journeys. But they had work to do on their own.

Even though Jesus was the most powerful and wisest teacher, God has always seemed to prefer to send imperfect, broken people to carry His most important messages to others. He sent the fathers, judges, prophets, apostles, disciples, and now he is sending us. "Go into all the world and preach the gospel to all creation (Mark 16:15). Even when you feel inadequate or ill equipped, remember that the One who knows ALL has confidence in you.

So, our confidence is never in ourselves to say the right things or to know whom we should reach out to next. It's exciting to remember that the gospel is GOD'S power to save people (Romans 1:16). It's not about our own power, talent, gracefulness, eloquence, or quick wit. When Moses reasoned that he wasn't a good speaker, God reassured him by saying, "I will be with your mouth and teach you what you will say" (Exodus 4:12). We will only succeed in the ministry of the gospel if we trust in God to help us reach the hearts of those around us.

How does this work? I don't know how God does what He does, but He is alive and working in the world today. "... He is not far from each one of us" (Acts 17:27). What He wants more than anything is to have more people turn to Him and go to heaven. So, as you are going, keep your eyes open for those who are hungering and thirsting for something more than this fallen world has to offer. Keep your heart open to the direction of the Holy Spirit toward the souls He has in mind for you to reach. Then, let Jesus make the difference.
