## ORDER APPOINTING INTERIM CO-LEAD CLASS COUNSEL AND EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE UNDER FED. R. CIV. P. 23

WHEREAS, on March 10, 2021, Plaintiffs Teresa Stringer, Karen Brooks, William Papania, Brandon Lane, Debbie O'Connor, Michelle Williams, Jayne Newton, and Beatriz Zavala ("Original Moving Plaintiffs") jointly moved to request appointment of Interim Co-Lead Counsel and an Executive Committee ("Original Motion")<sup>1</sup> to organize and prosecute claims asserted in the actions later consolidated by this Court by order of April 12, 2021 (the "Stipulated Order of Consolidation");<sup>2</sup>

WHEREAS after the filing of the Original Motion, two additional cases were filed alleging substantially similar facts and claims against the same defendants<sup>3</sup> and the Original Moving Plaintiffs, along with three new plaintiffs, Menachem Landa, Andrea Eliason, and Wayne Balnicki, (together, all Plaintiffs are the "Moving Plaintiffs") filed a Supplement to the Original Motion requesting the Court to consolidate all five of the above-captioned actions, including the two newly filed actions, and requesting the appointment of additional members of the proposed Executive Committee identified in the Original Motion (the "Supplement");<sup>4</sup>

WHEREAS the Stipulated Order of Consolidation consolidated all Plaintiffs owning Rogue vehicles into the Stringer Action and all Plaintiffs owning Pathfinder vehicles into the Lane Action and ordered the Moving Plaintiffs to file Amended Complaints in the Stringer Action and the Lane Action by no later than April 16, 2021; <sup>5</sup>

WHEREAS, on April 9, 2021, Nissan North America, Inc. ("NNA") filed its response to the Original Motion and Supplement, which states that it takes "no position on the issue of Plaintiffs' request to appoint interim co-lead class counsel and executive committee;"6

WHEREAS, the Court has received no opposition to the Moving Plaintiffs' request to appoint Interim Co-Lead Counsel and Executive Committee;

WHEREAS, the Court finds that the issues concerning appointment of Interim Co-Lead Counsel and an Executive Committee have been adequately presented, and it has carefully considered the above motion, its supporting brief, and exhibits to same,

## IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

- 1. The Moving Plaintiffs' motion to appoint Interim Co-Lead Counsel and an Executive Committee pursuant to Fed. R. Civ. P. 23(g) is hereby **GRANTED**, and the Court appoints Marc L. Godino of Glancy, Prongay, & Murray LLP, J. Gerard Stranch of Branstetter, Stranch & Jennings PLLC and Mark S. Greenstone of Greenstone Law APC as Interim Co-Lead Counsel and Stephen R. Basser of Barrack, Rodos & Bacine, Lawrence Deutsch of Berger Montague PC, and Ryan McDevitt of Keller Rohrback, L.L.P. as members of the Executive Committee in the *Stringer* Action and *Lane* Action consolidated by the Stipulated Order of Consolidation.
- 2. **Duties of Interim Co-Lead Counsel**: Interim Co-Lead Counsel shall be responsible for the overall conduct of the litigation on behalf of the proposed class. Interim Co-Lead Counsel shall be responsible for the following with regard to this matter:
  - a. Supervise all pretrial, trial and post-trial proceedings;
  - b. Sign any pleadings, motions, briefs, discovery requests or objections, subpoenas or notices;
  - Determine and present in motions, briefs, oral argument, or such other fashion
    as may be appropriate, the position of all of the proposed class as to all matters
    arising during pretrial and trial proceedings;
  - d. Conduct discovery on behalf of the named plaintiffs and the class consistent with the requirements of Fed. R. Civ. P. 26(b)(1), 26(b)(2), and 26(g);
  - e. Designate attorneys to act as spokespersons at pretrial conferences;
  - f. Negotiate and enter into stipulations and agreements with defense counsel with respect to all matters in this litigation, including discovery and settlement matters;

g. Coordinate and oversee the implementation and administration of any

settlement;

h. Coordinate the activities of all plaintiffs' counsel, and implement procedures

to ensure that schedules are met and unnecessary expenditures of time and

funds are avoided;

Employ and consult with experts;

Call meetings of plaintiffs' counsel when deemed appropriate;

k. Delegate tasks to members of the Executive Committee and otherwise

coordinate the work of all plaintiffs' counsel, and perform such other duties as

the Interim Co-Lead Counsel deem necessary or as authorized by further order

of the Court; and

1. To perform such other pretrial duties as may be incidental to the proper

coordination of pretrial activities or authorized by further order of the Court.

3. **Duties of the Executive Committee:** Members of the Executive Committee shall be

responsible for aiding Co-Lead Counsel for all tasks delegated by the Interim Co-Lead Counsel to

members of the Executive Committee.
