Barton & Guestier is one of the oldest and most prestigious wine negociants in Bordeaux. The firm was established in 1725 by Thomas Barton, renowned négociant. Daniel Guestier was a reputed importer of Bordeaux wines into Baltimore, in the British colonies in America, and the one who delivered the wines of Bordeaux that President Thomas Jefferson had ordered from Barton.

"Léobourg"

AOC MEDOC

Barton & Guestier, owner of Château Magnol in the Bordeaux region, has vinified the most famous French Appellations for almost 3 centuries. Since the 1900's, our Médoc has been named Léobourg from les Hauts Bourgs (High Villages) meaning grapes are picked in the highest vineyards of the appellation.

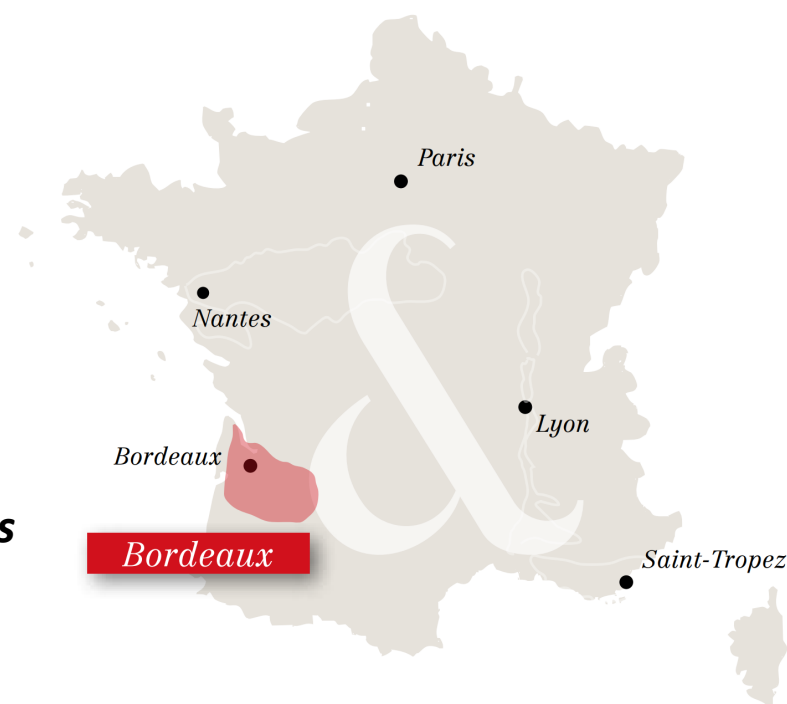
Appellation: AOC Médoc

Location: Situated on the left bank of the Gironde estuary.

Grape Varieties: 60% Cabernet Sauvignon, 40% Merlot

Tasting note: Deep red color with violet highlights. Intense nose of blackcurrant aromas with vanilla and spicy notes. Good concentration on the palate, with present and well-integrated tannins. Persistent and delicate oaky finish.

Pairing: Red meat, game, cheese.

Soil: Sandy and Gravelly

Climate: Oceanic

Vines Age: 5-25 years

Harvest starting date: 29th August 2018

Viticulture: An ideal weather conditions with a warm and dry summer, resulting in high-quality grapes and excellent aging potential for this wine.

Winemaking: Controlled De-stalked grapes – alcoholic fermentation at 30-32°C / 86-90°F with daily pumping over maceration (3 weeks) – malolactic fermentation. Ageing partly in oak for 3 months.
