- Visit the actual sites of attacks and get detailed briefings that will help deepen your understanding



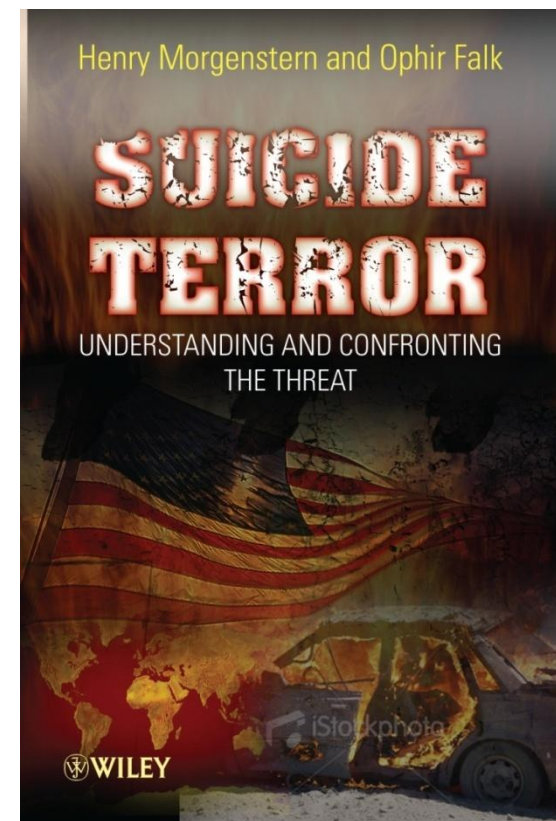
What can US Homeland Security learn from Israel's experience?

The “Pillars” of the Workshop

Some of the topics to be covered in the Workshop:



- **Infrastructure Security** – *site visit to Ashkelon Power Plant whose proximity to Gaza makes it prone to rocket attacks; meet with administration to see how they combat the hot zone threat*

- **Port Security** – *site visit to Port of Ashdod, the lifeblood of commerce, under constant threat, case study on terror attempts there*



- **VIP Protection** - *module focuses on case study of assassination of prime minister, Yitzhak Rabin, in 1995 by visiting the location and hearing from members of the operations team from the event and learning why the security failure occurred*

The “Pillars” of the Workshop

- **Public Event and Public Safety Security** including Mall Security - *site visit to Azrieli Center, one of largest malls in all of Israel, located in Tel Aviv*



- **Government Building Security** - *site visit with head of security of the Knesset which houses the legislative body of the Israeli government*

- **Aviation Security** - *Former El Al security director speaks about his experiences at the airline that has avoided terror incidents since 1983*



The “Pillars” of the Workshop



- **School Safety** – *case study of the 1994 attack in the cafeteria at Hebrew University in Tel Aviv*

- **IEDs/VBIEDs**– *learn from explosives expert on how to recognize IEDs, including various forms of delivery and how to respond to each*



- **Special Counter Terror Unit**– *Best Practices on converting police to counter terror units from Israeli expert with IDF Special Forces background*

- With 20 years of history in Israel, the Global Security Workshop is able to provide access to areas that would never be possible otherwise.

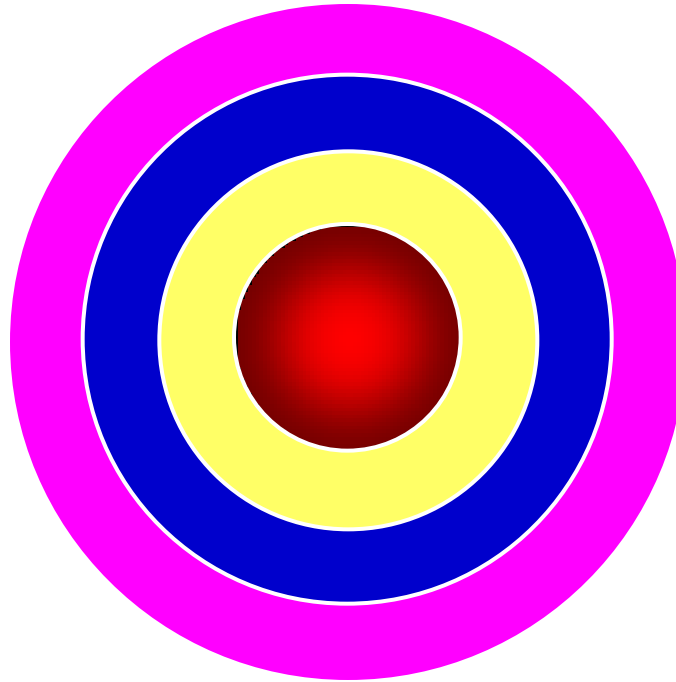

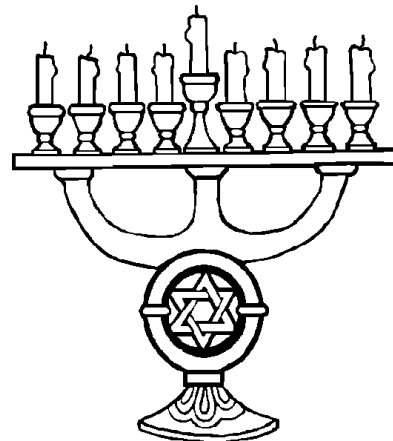


Learn what to look for...
