# **21ST CENTURY LEARNING AT GATESTONE**

Last year, our fundraising focus was to raise funds to purchase the Information Technology (IT) needed to develop the skills of 21st Century Fluencies.

Overall, Gatestone has spent in excess of \$50,000 this year to augment our IT inventory, using funds from the \$32,000 grant from the Heritage Green Community Trust combined with funds from School Council and school budget.

# **New Technology**

This year we added:

- 40 iPads with the "apps" needed to develop the 21<sup>st</sup> Century Fluencies;
- I Mac Mini with a screen to manage the iPads;
- 7 Lenovo Desktop
   Computers for use in the Library and in the Grade Eight Pod;
- 20 Lenovo Laptop Computers (12 of which are for use by students with special educational needs);
- 10 data projectors w i t h A p p l e Televisions to wirelessly project student learning and learning media onto screens;

- Smartboard with attached data projector and Apple TV;
- 2 Copernicus Smartboard Suites into Kindergarten

# **Student Learning**

The impact on student learning has been incredible. Here is a snapshot of how of students have used IT as learning tools this year:

- Students use IT daily as dictionaries, encyclopedia, word processors, cameras, video recorders and assistive technology;
- Grade Eights have used iPads and Laptops as tools to provide their "student voice" regarding moving to Saltfleet next year;
- Students are submitting their work and then receiving feedback from a teacher or peers digitally via Google Docs;
- Students using an iPad app called Educreations to record and scribe their thinking in mathematics and to make their learning visible;

short videos (public s e r v i c e announcements, dramatic performances, etc.) using iMovie.

# Next Year and Beyond

As we look ahead, we will be learning alongside our students as we strive to ensure that our students are using IT as a tool to engage their creativity, develop their higher-order thinking skills and make their learning visible.

#### SECURITY MEASURES

Following the tragedy at Sandy Hook Elementary School, the Ontario Government committed to making schools more secure through locked front doors with camera and intercom systems.

Work on this initiative begins this summer and, with the input of School Council, we have decided to explore additional security measures for our backdoor and portables as well as our front door.

The cost of the additional measures will be carried at the school level rather than at the Board level, but School Council believes that the safety and security of students is a priority. The Admin Team agrees and we have earmarked funds to

complete this work in the new school year.
