FIRST NATION, MÉTIS, AND INUIT SELF-IDENTIFICATION:

In January 2012, Hamilton -Wentworth District School Board (HWDSB) approved the First Nation, Métis and Inuit Education Policy. One aspect of this policy includes the implementation of a Directive for Voluntary, Confidential First Nation, Métis, and Inuit Self-Identification.

As part of implementing this directive, our students were sent home with a brochure that explains voluntary self-identification.

Parents, caregivers/ guardians of students with First Nation, Métis, or Inuit ancestry are asked to fill out the self-identification form and return it to the office at their child's school. We are requesting parents and guardians of students under 18 to identify if their child is of First Nation, Métis, or Inuit ancestry.

Self-identification is voluntary and confidential; and does not require parents, students or caregivers/guardians to produce any documentation, i.e. Indian Status/Métis card. etc.

While the self-identification process

does not impact all students and families across HWDSB, it will provide an opportunity to build awareness for everyone regarding the cultural and historic experiences of Canada's First Nation (Status and Non-Status), Métis, and Inuit peoples.

We will also invite staff, students, and the community to participate in several events to understand and appreciate the rich histories and culture of Aboriginal peoples. For more information, please contact Bill Torrens.

EQAO

Annually, the Education Quality a n d Accountability Office, EQAO, assesses Grade Three and Six Students in the areas of Reading, Writing and Mathematics ensure that our education system is preparing students for success. It is based on the Ontario Curriculum and a grading format is used to ensure that children are scored in a consistent, fair manner. The information gathered in the assessments is proparents/ to caregivers and to the school. It is used to assist in school planning in the following year. For example, the EQAO data can help us, as a Staff, identify where our students excel and where additional support and instruction is needed.

Our teachers have been working all year to prepare the students for the assessment and in May we will "bump up" our efforts and simulate the assessment (use old EQAO materials, use the same timeframe, provide no help, etc.) to help the

DROP OFF AND PICK UP

Traffic in front of the school is becoming a major concern.

Unfortunately, the school was not designed to have a drop-off area for passenger cars at the front. Only buses should use this area for drop-off and pick-up.

Please drop you children off on a side street or another safe place rather than in our laneway. Perhaps the most congested place is the parking area at the side of the school. It was not designed as a roundabout. Please do not drop off your child there and then precede to turnaround. As well,

please do not drop-off your children in the middle lane of our front lane. This increases the likelihood of a child being hit by car in the curb lane. Please either walk your children to school or drop them off on a side street.
