## **SUMMER LEARNING**

Summer is a wonderful, risk-free, time for students to practice and build on the skills they developed during the previous year.

Here are a few possible summer learning activities for students:

- Read something they have picked (book, comics, magazines, etc.) for 10 to 30 minutes daily;
- Be read to by a parent or older child (this will help the older child);
- Visit the Library weekly to pick new reading materials;
- Create art projects using household recyclables (paper, toilet rolls, cardboard, etc.);
- Write grocery lists, notes, etc.;
- Maintain a journal or diary;
- Use math skills to help with cooking or baking;

- Use measuring skills to draw or map (i.e. a floor plan of the home or street map of the neighbourhood);
- Begin a collection that needs to be counted, sorted and classified (bugs, coins, beads, etc.);
- Practice counting and grouping by rolling coins.


