Here is a brief overview of the Tribes program.

Our 2013-14 EQAO Results have been released and we have had another successful year.

Here are the results for those students who wrote the assessment. Percentage of students working at the provincial standard or higher:

Grade Six: Reading 69 Writing 71, Mathematics 51

EMERGENCY PROCEDURES DRILLS: FIRE DRILLS & LOCKDOWN

We are committed to keeping your children safe while they are in our care. One of the ways we keep them safe is to practice our emergency procedures.

We will practice two full school evacuations (Fire Drill) in Sept & October and we will undertake one of our Emergency Procedures Drills (Lockdown) on October 6th at 10:10 am.

During our Lockdown Drill we simulate an emergency within the school that would require the school to be "locked down". Staff will secure the students in their class

rooms and wait until we are "all clear".

The Hamilton Police Service will be on-site to support our drill and share their feedback and suggestions.

Fortunately, the weather cooperated and all teams had terrific weather for play. Special thanks to Mr. Lane and Mr. Lamarre for coaching the teams.


Thanks too to those parents who volunteered to drive players to the tournaments.

TRANSPORTATION

This year Gatestone received a larger than usual number of courtesy transportation requests. Unfortunately, we were unable to provide transportation for all families that requested it.

The school bus is for students in grades 1-8

that live 1.6km or farther from the school and for JK & SK students that live farther than 1.0km from the school. The Board of Education Transportation Department determines who meets this distance criteria.

These students take up the majority of the seats

on the bus. For the empty spaces we have left, the school **may** provide courtesy transportation for families in need.

Courtesy riders must remember that their seat is conditional on space available and behavior on the bus.

We are using Information
