





We like to think of International China Concern as a family. Like many families we enjoy getting together for a party and in March we had an opportunity to do just that as we celebrated the tenth anniversary of our first residential centre in Changsha, Hunan Province. Throughout the year there have been many reasons to celebrate. Here's a snapshot of our journey through 2007...

We received approval to begin Community Outreach from the Civil Affairs Bureau. Community Outreach provides essential support services to families with special needs children. This represents a massive step forward in our goal to help Chinese families caring for children with disabilities and reduce abandonment.

827 people like you sponsored 235 children and young adults with disabilities and helped them to live fulfilling lives in safe and loving homes. 182 new sponsors joined us during the year.

89 people from 8 countries joined our China Teams and travelled thousands of miles to serve our children and young adults.

More than 700 people took part in our first international fundraiser, Walk the Wall, and raised an amazing USD225,000.

Every month more than 1,200 people received our Prayer Calendar and prayed for China and the needs of the abandoned and disabled.

We trained 53 Chinese social welfare workers from 15 welfare centres to enable them to care for children with disabilities.

There were comings and goings as 18 people answered the call and joined our team of international volunteers. God answered our prayers and yours, providing a new China Operations Director, Member Care Director, and Research and Development Manager.

Three of our team, Jan Steffan (Australia), Janet Lam (Canada), and Sue Munday (UK) returned to their home countries after years of service and we thank them for their wonderful contribution.

A small army of volunteers worked worldwide to share the needs of China's abandoned and disabled children with their friends, families, colleagues and church groups.

Together we did something amazing. With God's help we bought love, hope and opportunity to China's abandoned and disabled. To every single person who played a part we simply say 'Thank You'.
