

- (e) descriptions of God as the first and the last; and
- (f) these messages are no longer addressed to the blind and sinful servant Jacob."

The Beginning of the Remember Progressive Revelation? The Redeemer is fully presented to the World

- Recap Chapter 42: 1"Behold, My Servant, whom I uphold; My chosen one in whom My soul delights. I have put My Spirit upon Him; He will bring forth justice (not to correct a mistake but to keep the mistake from happening) to the nations.
 - Justice is God's 1st quality. The first attribute of personage—not love.
- 2"He will not cry out or raise His voice, Nor make His voice heard in the street.
- 3"A bruised reed He will not break And a dimly burning wick He will not extinguish; He will faithfully bring forth justice. Isaiah 42:1–3

Words not Swords are the Greatest Threat

- Words (act as swords and arrows) convince and allows the person to live and have a productive life. But—
- The sword kills ends the person's contribution it is squashed even for "their cause."
- "But he who sins against me (wisdom) injures himself; All those who hate me (wisdom) love death." Proverbs 8:36
- Even killing the most helpless, the unborn infants because they pose a threat to a woman's freedom. But it is in motherhood they find their meaning. The Proverb is true—They do love death more than life! Even if it means the annihilation of humanity—it will be worth it!

The Servant

- From our perspective it is easy to see the Divine Person and His ministry in these verses.
 - Being hidden is of course relative—not hidden for the righteous.
- Yet to some He was revealed—but for most he was an enigma or a hidden "something foreign" that they could not explain—thus kill.
- Then, the sharp sword and sharp arrows are pictures of His mouth teaching truth—and it cuts across or pierces the conscience of the guilty.
- Nothing is more sensitive and more protected than the conscience which stands as an internal unforgiving judge.

The Son is Identified with Israel Can we imagine this posture in Jesus' prayer in the Garden?

- [DISCOVERY?] ³He [Father] said to Me [Son], "You are My Servant, Israel, [Jesus is a Jew, thus a "perfect Israel" fits] In Whom I will show My glory."
- [Failure?] 'But I [the Son could say] said, "I have toiled in vain, I have spent My strength for nothing and vanity; (In faith) Yet surely the justice due to Me is with the Lord, And My reward with My God."
- [Mission] ⁵And now says the Lord, who formed Me from the womb to be His Servant, To bring <u>Jacob back to Him</u>, so that Israel might be gathered to Him (For I am honored in the sight of the Lord, And My God is My strength,) Isaiah 49:3–5

The Father Explains the Son's Mission

- 6He says, (to the Son who could ask—) "It is too "small (light) a thing" that You should be My Servant To raise up the tribes of Jacob and to restore the preserved ones of Israel; I will also make You a light of the nations So that My salvation may reach to the end of the earth." Isaiah 49:6
- Spoken from the most critical point of view to make the point of a comprehensive restoration.

"It is too small a thing that You should be My Servant To raise up the tribes of Jacob..."

- "God indicates that the Servant's work would not receive great worldwide honor if he just took on the "smaller, lighter, easier."
- The task of restoring the tribes of Israel (as a small percentage of the people on the earth).
- "Therefore, God also gave him the task of reaching out to transform all the nations of the earth.
- "This should not be understood chronologically to suggest that the Servant got a revised job description at some point along the way, long after he received his first assignment."

- "God's original plan always was to use the seed of Abram to bring his blessings on all the nations of the earth (Gen 12:3), and the earlier Servant poem already listed being a covenant to the nations as part of the Servant's purpose (42:6). Isaiah 2:1-5; 14:1-3; 19:18-25; and 45:18-25 already have confirmed that God desired to include the nations as eventual members of his kingdom, so this is not an adjustment in God's playbook to correct a defect in his strategic plan. God's desire was to greatly honor the Servant, so he gave him the tremendous responsibility of bringing God's salvation to the ends of the earth."

The Pay Off of the Servant

- 7Thus says the Lord, the Redeemer of Israel and its Holy One, To the despised One (Son), To the One abhorred by the nation, To the Servant of rulers,
 - "Kings will see and arise, Princes will also bow down,
 - Because of the Lord who is faithful, the Holy One of Israel who has chosen You."
- 8Thus says the Lord, "In a favorable time I have answered You, And in a day of salvation I have helped You; And I will keep You and give You for a covenant of the people, [the Son's appearance guarantees the rest of the promises] To restore the land, to make them inherit the desolate heritages; Isaiah 49:7–8

19"Therefore repent and return, so that your sins may be wiped away, in order that times of refreshing may come from the presence of the Lord; 20 and that He may send Jesus, the Christ appointed for you, 21 whom heaven must receive until the period of restoration of all things about which God spoke by the mouth of His holy prophets from ancient time. Acts 3:19-21

Kingdom Conditions

- 11" will make all My mountains a road, And My highways will be raised up. (Flattened earth the recreation)
- 12"Behold, these will come from afar; And lo, these will come from the north and from the west, And these from the land of Sinim." (Egypt or China)
- Kingdom talk: ¹³Shout for joy, O heavens! And rejoice, O earth! Break forth into joyful shouting, O mountains! For the Lord has comforted His people (Isa. 40:1-5 "all flesh will see it together") And (the Lord) will have compassion on His afflicted. Isaiah 49:11–13

An Explanation of the Comparisons This is true whenever there is Kingdom talk

- When Kingdom conditions are given as—"Nor will the scorching heat or sun strike them down," we need not think that in the Kingdom the sun will send scorching heat. The point is that—
- The comparison is between the "cursed earth condition" and the "restored earth condition."
- In other words today you could be scorched by the sun but in the Kingdom the sun will not scorch.
- Comparisons are common contrasts between our day and that day.

Reassurances

- 14But Zion [faithful (srael) said, "The Lord has forsaken me, And the Lord has forgotten me."
- The Lord says: 1
- 5"Can a woman forget her nursing child And have no compassion on the son of her womb?
- Even these may forget, but I will not forget you. Isaiah 49:14–18

The contrast is between the past generations and the one to come!

The Kingdom a New Order Compared with the Old Order (our example)

- 16"Behold, I have inscribed you on the palms of My hands; Your walls are continually before Me.
- 17"Your builders hurry; Your destroyers and devastators Will depart from you.
- 18"Lift up your eyes and look around; All of them gather together, they come to you. As I live," declares the Lord, "You will surely put on all of them as jewels and bind them on as a bride. Isaiah 49:14–18

The Kingdom a New Order Ever growing family of children

- Consider: 19"For your waste and desolate places and your destroyed land—Surely now you will be too cramped for the inhabitants, And those who swallowed you will be far away.
- 20"The children of whom you were bereaved (stolen?) will yet say in your ears, 'The place is too cramped for me; Make room for me that I may live here.'
- 21"Then you will say in your heart, 'Who has begotten these for me, Since I have been bereaved of my children And am barren, an exile and a wanderer? And who has reared these? Behold, I was left alone; From where did these come?' " Isaiah 49:19–21

Who are these Bereaved Children

- Ed: These comments may give us an idea about the children of Israel who have been living obscurely in the lands of the Gentiles—are there hidden Jews in Gentile nations?
- Does God keep track of the Jewish descendants in the nations that have been unidentified in the Diaspora?
- This is an interesting idea to contemplate. As least there is an abundance of these children, the fear is that they will not fit into the Land. Interesting. It could be figurative but to consider the literal is intriguing.

The Kingdom a New Order

- 22Thus says the Lord God, "Behold, I will lift up My hand to the nations And set up My standard (impose My law) to the peoples; And they will bring your sons in their bosom, And your daughters will be carried on their shoulders. (Are these children the Jews that have been assimilated in the Gentile world?)
- 23"Kings will be your guardians, And their princesses your nurses. They will bow down to you with their faces to the earth And lick the dust of your feet; And you will know that I am the Lord; Those who hopefully wait for Me will not be put to shame.
- 24"Can the prey be taken from the mighty man, Or the captives of a tyrant be rescued?" (Surely they can be rescued!) Isaiah 49:22–25

The Kingdom a New Order

- 25Surely, thus says the Lord, "Even the captives of the mighty man will be taken away, And the prey of the tyrant will be rescued; For I will contend with the one who contends with you, And I will save your sons.
- 26"I will feed your oppressors with their own flesh, And they will become drunk with their own blood as with sweet wine; And all flesh will know that I, the Lord, am your Savior And your Redeemer, the Mighty One of Jacob." Isaiah 49:26 (Reminiscent of the Gog War and Armageddon clean up.)
