
VERBAL



OT - the Spirit appears in the text for specific and temporary work.

Gospels - the Spirit works through Jesus Christ in miracles and other specific times.

Epistles - the Spirit is dominant during what is sometimes called the "age of the Holy Spirit" the work of the Spirit is to glorify Christ.

Roman Social Order Before 484B.C.E

PATRICIANS

- Wealthy Landowners
- Came From Prominent Families
- Ruling Class, Senators, Consuls. Preators (Judges)
 - Were Military Leaders

PLEBIANS

- · Poor Citizens
- Could Not Hold Public Office
- Jobs Included Were Artists, shopkeepers, and Small Farm Owners
- . Lacked Basic Rights, Like Not Able To Vote

FREEMEN

- · Former Slaves
- Worked As Midwives, Craftsmen, or Traders
 - Had A Full Roman Citizenship, They Just Couldn't Hold Public Office
- · Lacked Basic Rights, Like They Couldn't Vote

Slaves

- Were Often Mistreated; Were Whipped or Branded
 - · Could Be Killed For No Reason
- Were Often Foreigners Caught And Sold For Money
 - Worked In Patricians Houses, Mines, Factories, Etc.
