Deaf Ministry Signing the Truth

The purpose of the Deaf Ministry is to "Sign the Truth" and Lori Beard has been signing for the Deaf since 1986.

"The Deaf and hard of hearing cannot hear the Word in the traditional sense," Lori said, "but God has provided a way through sign language, so the Deaf can see the Word of God, and come to believe in the Savior."

Gil preaches to the Deaf and hearing each week. The Deaf receive the same message from the Bible as everyone else, just in ASL (American Sign Language).

"We would love to see more Deaf people at Indian Hills," Lori said. "We have signers who work very hard at translating the music into a visual interpretation of what we hear and sing and we are able to interpret the message of hope. Gil's messages are very clear. If you know a Deaf person, please tell them we have an interpreter for all services."

A Deaf person is not likely to attend church or any event without an interpreter since he would not be able to hear or understand anything spoken. That is why we need to be intentional in inviting the Deaf to church. All the Deaf people that have come to IHCC have come because of an invitation. If a Deaf person needs more information, or wants to confirm that there will be an interpreter, give him Lori's number (402-560-1380 text and voice).

Lori grew up in a suburb south of Chicago and attended a Baptist church with her family. "I heard the gospel at church and from my parents ever since I can remember," Lori said. "When I was four years old, I got into trouble, and for the first time I realized I was a sinner. Although I prayed for salvation at that young age, I don't think that's when I truly was born again. But, a seed was planted and



God worked in my life in many ways over the years to bring me into His family."

Although Lori cannot pinpoint her actual day of salvation, she believes Jesus died on the cross to pay the penalty for her sins and her desire is to honor God in everything she says and does.

As a child, Lori would occasionally get into trouble for talking in school. But it was in high school that, "My best friend and I thought it would be fun to learn sign language so we could talk without getting in trouble."

Lori and her family moved to Lincoln just before her sophomore year. "The first time we visited Indian Hills we knew we were home," Lori said.

In high school, Lori wanted to be a legal secretary and learned how to use a Dictaphone machine. "My goal was to see how far ahead the speaker could dictate with me remembering it." Lori did not know it at the time, but God was

preparing her to listen to interpret for the Deaf.

Deaf ministry workers are attending a Christian Interpreter Workshop in Omaha today. They are attending workshops to learn more about accurately signing the Bible, signing music, ethics and what Deaf Ministries look like with an interpreter. Those attending the workshop are: Ili Lefler, Carol Schroer, Luke Pelton, Perry Beard, and Lori Beard.

The Deaf Ministry is planning a Deaf Conference at The Hills on October 6 and 7. Those attending will learn about Lordship Salvation: What does it mean to make Jesus the Lord of your life?

Please be praying for wisdom and endurance for the upcoming IHCC Deaf Conference on Lordship Salvation. "Also, please pray that the Lord will be honored in our service of Him in all that we do," Lori said, "and that the Deaf will come to a true, saving knowledge of Jesus and make Him Lord of their lives."

Is Baptism Part of Salvation?

On Pentecost Sunday, Peter presented the gospel and showed how the Old Testament prophesied the death of the Messiah and His subsequent resurrection. He said to the Jews:

Repent, and each of you be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins; and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit (Acts 2:38).

This verse is confusing for many because it appears that Peter commanded repentance *and* baptism to receive forgiveness of sins and the gift of the Spirit. However, Peter preached the message of salvation without mentioning baptism several times, so clearly baptism is not required for salvation.

After healing the lame man, Peter said to the gathering crowd:

Therefore repent and return, so that your sins may be wiped away (Acts 3:19).

Peter didn't say anything about baptism at that time. He told the people to repent, to change their minds about their sin, and turn to God through faith in Jesus Christ, and their sins would be wiped away.

After telling the Jewish Council that they had hung the Messiah on a cross, Peter said:

He is the one whom God exalted to His right hand as a Prince and a Savior, to grant repentance to Israel, and forgiveness of sins (Acts 5:31). Peter presented forgiveness of sins in the context of repentance. The theme, "repentance for forgiveness of sins" runs throughout the Book of Acts. Repentance was to be publicly declared through water baptism.

We find Peter preaching to the Gentiles at the house of Cornelius:

Of Him [Christ] all the prophets bear witness that through His name everyone who believes in Him receives forgiveness of sins (Acts 10:43).

After the Gentiles believed, and the Holy Spirit was poured out on them, Peter said:

Surely no one can refuse the water for these to be baptized who have received the Holy Spirit just as we did, can he? (v. 47).

In Acts 2:38, Peter was instructing the Jews to be baptized as a testimony of their faith in Jesus Christ. Baptism proclaimed a person's identification with Christ—no secret disciples were allowed.

Repentance alone brings forgiveness and the indwelling of the Holy Spirit. The water baptism that follows is a testimony to that repentance. Water baptism is not necessary for salvation, but it is an important part of a believer's testimony. Peter called on the Jews to believe in Christ for forgiveness of sin and to testify to that faith through water baptism.
